Ream's pa eni corn harvester is shother implement of agricultural life which will be interessing to farmers. This maching is very simple in its construction, and purports to cut, with the labor of one herse ports to cut, with the labor of one horse and a boy, from ixteen to twenty seres of core par chy, and lay it in bundles of from two to ten hills, as desired. An ingentious part of, this machine, is an appliance called a drooper, by which he boy riding on his back of the horse can drop the bundles of corn at suitable distances in the degrees, all resdy for shocking. The cost of his machine is reasonable—ranging from fifteen to twenty dollars. The speed of this machine is very desirable, as farmers consider it the best time as extreme when the dwe is out to stalks, cut corn when the dew is on the stalks, immediately after a rain. In dry times corn is brittle and difficult to cut. If this is able to accomplish that for which it is recommended, it must be a great ad-vantage, and very valuable to farmers.
