RAILROADS VS. CANALS.—It is supposed that the receipts of the New York Canals and this year will show a falling off of over \$800,000. Thus, in 135 years, freedom has increased more than 100 per cent, while the number of slaves has diminished from 334 down to about six per cent of the entire population.
