Seventy battleships would cost at prevailing prices about \$550,000,000, more than that cost before we sank a world famous naval vessel. It is interesting to note that a naval board laid down a comprehensive plan of our desirable naval strength and placed our needs at just 10 battleships. These have changed since.
