Water bills for five heavy users are likely to go up, the Board of Public Affairs indicated Monday

"Water supplied to users who consume more than 100,000 gal-"Water supplied to users who consume more than 100,000 gallons a quarter comes too cheaply," one member of the Board said. Present rates are 15 eents per thousand gallons for consumption over 100,000 gallons a quarter. "The figure of \$1 a thousand for the first 6,000 and 40 cents a thousand for the next 14,000 gallons seems right enough," he said, "and I don't think there is any need to increase the rates for users
