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GOP starts county fund drive

A "neighbor-to-neighbor" campaign to give every Republican voter a voice in policy and to support the party financially is planned for Huron county next month.

An organization to call on each of the estimated 10,000 Republicans is being formed by Richard E. Mutz, chairman of the county GOP finance committee.

A special gift campaign will be conducted the last two weeks in June.

The committee is seeking to raise \$15,000. First meeting is scheduled for the Norwalk Elks Country club May 19. Courtney Burton, state finance chairman, E. Blair Schreyer, the financial committee's executive secretary, and Jack B. Nordholdt, are planning to attend the dinner.

"There has been increasing sentiment to spread the base

of political contributions and to get a real grass roots expression on party policy," Mr. Mutz stated, in announcing the plans. "All Huron county Republicans will have an opportunity to participate this year."

"Every Republican voter will be asked to give at least \$1 of finance party activities during this important election year. At the same time, each voter will be given a questionnaire to express his or her major issues."

The organization being planned is to divide the county into 10 districts, each with a survey and conducting the drives. The first phase, being conducted by Jack Gerkin, is concerned with finding all the Republican voters so that a complete card record can be maintained. Assisting Mr. Mutz on the finance committee are John E. Wise, Mrs. W.

H. Kauffman of Willard, Lewis is McLaughlin, Dudley A. White, Jr., and Joe Dudley, chairman. The chairman will appoint an area leader for each precinct in his district. The area leaders will obtain a solicitor for each 15 Republican homes. The district area leaders, their wives and husbands, will attend the dinner on the 19th.
