Legal advertisements stating what will be bought, and when, and under that circumstances, must be published a advance of the date when bids will be received so that the public's right-tal interest will be protected.

Exceptions are permitted by law when-er there is a justifiable emergency at will not allow of sufficient time solicit bids.

This is not a right to be abused.

Those who think that the requirement to advertise bids is a get-rich scheme for newspaper publishers simply ignore the facts.

The first is that the rate for payment for legal notices is set by law, the General Assembly in its wisdom has deded upon a rate that it finds to be the rand equitable for the service performed. No publisher may exceed that


