'No annexation, no utilities', council tells applicant here

An ordinance prohibiting extension of utilities outside the corporate limits was approved on second reading before village council Tuesday night.

The vote came after council members heard a request from Roger Colins for utilities to property he is considering purchasing east of the Barnes property in Trux street.

Eugene Gerken, sewer engineer, reported the meeting he attended with Mayor Hugh W. Washburn and Administrator William Forquer with officials of the FHA in Columbus Thursday was the most cordial he has attended. Indications of a payment to discontinue service to such premises of water supplied by the village waterworks system until such unpaid sewer charges have been fully paid.

All members agreed to the suggestion except for Councilman Robert A. McKown, who abstained. He has objected to the validity of the sewer charge in the past and is among the delinquent accounts.

Forquer, appointed by the mayor last week as the village's third administrator, received confirmation to his appointment by five council members. Councilman Wayne Strine said Forquer resigned as councilman because of ill health and less than six months later contends he is capable of a more demanding assignment.

Forquer will receive an annual salary of \$8,500, set for the position last month.

The mayor read a letter from members of the Daughters of Union Veterans compelling cemetery employees for their work in making Greenlawn an outstanding setting for the annual Memorial day services.

He also told the council that Mrs. Duane Hunter, a member of the Plymouth Garden club, planted flowers around the village building. The clerk is to write her an official letter thanking her.

Councilman Edward O. Ramey proposed an emergency ordinance setting up penalties for traffic entering the Square and taking the wrong lanes. All traffic westbound from Route 603 (Trux street) is to proceed in the center lane. Only vehicles planning to park in the Square may use the right hand lane in Main street.

Big Red half mile relay team won fifth place with a time of 1 min. 33.5 secs.

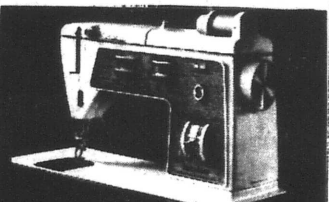

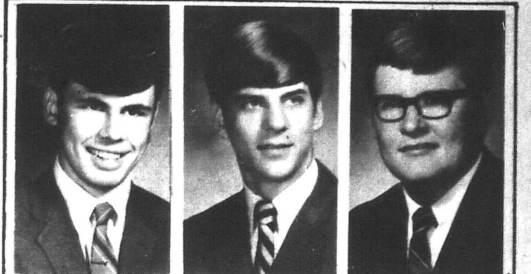
Bob Davis wins bowling trophy for top average
