Weikel spent \$6,096 on reelection

A successful campaign for reelection cost Richard E. Weikel \$6,096, about 55 per cent of the salary of the job, he swore in a report filed with the county board of elections.

Shilohans face raise in rates for telephone

Shilohans got a not-so-welcome Christmas present a bit early Dec. 13. United Telephone Co. of Ohio, which serves the village, asked the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio for a \$17 million rate increase.

If granted, the rate increase would average 14 cents a day additional for each customer. This is the equivalent of \$37.96 a year.

Robert R. Snedaker, Jr., president of United, said in a statement the company seeks only to obtain the maximum profit return allowed by Ohio law of 6.09 per cent.

So that Bloominggrove and Cass townships can legally join the Village of Shiloh in a three-way co-egal partnership in the purchase of a new fire station, Shiloh threw out Dec. 13 all bids to erect it and voted to seek new bids.

Only 10 telephones are available now, Councilman Clarence (Joe) Harris said, for use by fire and ambulance personnel. In March, when new equipment is installed, the number available will be 30.

Shiloh got \$1,083 as the first half of federal revenue sharing, the clerk, Mrs. Robert Boock, reported. Councilmen and Mayor Grady McDonald expressed disappointment.

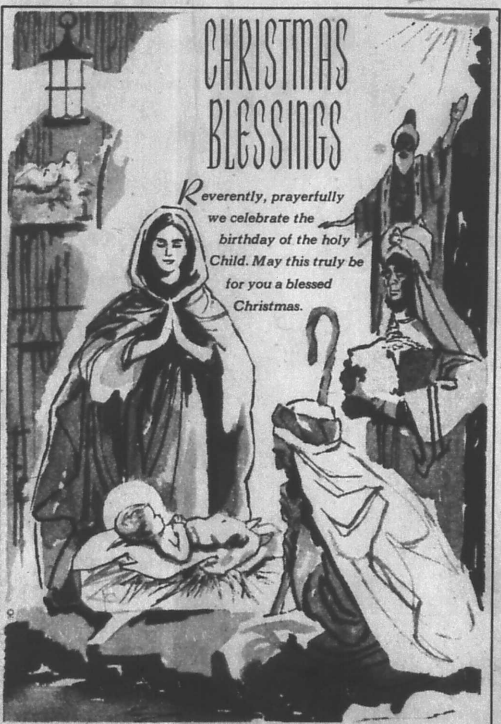

Snow chokes local roads

First heavy snow of the season struck Friday at 10:35 a. m. and in three hours had deposited four to five inches across Shiloh and Richland counties.

High winds and dropping temperatures Friday night caused deep drifting and by Saturday morning Norwalk headquarters of the state highway patrol reported most north-south secondary roads were all but impassible. It said only emergency traffic could pass.

Locally, traffic bound south of Plymouth encountered more difficulty than traffic bound north. The publisher of the Shelby Daily Globe was forced to turn back at Morse's hill in Route 61 Friday morning because his sedan could not climb the hill.

Jacque Donnenworth and John Ganzhorn, Jr., en route to employment at Mansfield Saturday morning, could not get through Route 61, where there was obstruction caused by four vehicles across the roadway on the curve north of the stock farm.

Shrimp dandy for Yuletide

Serve it with gingerbread that George Washington ate!

What is more quiet and nicer than Christmas eve? Everything wrapped, stockings hung, even a piece of mistletoe, candle lighted. Perhaps the one night in the year when everything is picked up and neat.
This year it falls on a Sunday, and many will have family dinners. But for those who will have theirs on Christmas day, it is a night to relax, perhaps think of what it all means, and move very slowly.
You cannot do this unless you have moved rather quickly earlier in the day.
Scurry around and fix up a casserole and bake

something for a light meal -- since the next day, you will most likely eat too much. This will then give you time to sit and read the book which seems to be causing a furor. "Jonathan Livingston Seagull". It is lovely, and everyone should read it. It is a fantasy, and for a while you will feel as though you are soaring in the air with a crazy bird. I am glad that I read the book before I found our copy of Time which dissected it to a degree that the whole thing was spoiled. Don't miss it, and it can be a lovely gift too. Even the publishers had trouble deciding if it should be for children or adults, so it

hits every age group.
For the casserole, there are all sorts of things. For years we always had lasagna because it could be made up ahead and merely put in the oven to heat up.
This year, it's shrimp. Even though you may be the only one in your family who really and truly likes it that much, they will all enjoy this... at least hope.
This would serve four and can be doubled, but it is wise to make two batches.
Cook two cups of rice so it is ready.
Then melt a fourth of a cup of butter with a small amount of finely cut onion. Have ready a fourth of a cup of flour mixed with a dash of salt and paprika and about a teaspoon of curry powder (if you like curry, add more). Stir into the butter until you get a smooth paste, then gradually stir in a cup and a half of warmed milk. Once you have the sauce under control, add three tablespoons of catsup and one fourth of a cup of sherry. Add two cups of shrimp, more if you have it.
Mix this with the rice, which should be cooked by now, and put into a greased casserole. Since everything is already cooked in it, you can just heat it up in the oven when you are ready.

A tossed salad, and perhaps a small relish dish with a sturdy gingerbread, and it should be a beautiful holiday supper.
The gingerbread can be also made early in the morning, or even the day before. It is for real, not the airy package stuff, and this recipe has a history. It comes from the new cook book we just got and it's the one that George Washington's mother, Mary, served to General Lafayette in 1784. I has been handed down in the family from his sister, Betty Washington Lewis, to Eleanor Washington Spicer, the president-general of the Daughters of the American Revolution.
Mix together a half cup each of butter and brown sugar, and when blended, add a cup of molasses (the regular kind) with a half cup of warmed milk.
To this mixture add a little more than a teaspoon of cinnamon, a teaspoon of mace and one of nutmeg. Mix and add a small wine glass of brandy.
Beat three eggs until fluffy and add them to the other mixture with three cups of flour. When this is all mixed, add to it all a teaspoon of soda dissolved in a very small amount of water, the juice and rind of one orange and a cup of raisins. Bake in a good sized bread pan

at 350 degrees. If you want to cut it in squares, then use a large cake pan.

Ex-PHS grid coach writes book for coaches

The gritty gritty involved in seeing up a high-powered 12-month high school football program is explored in a 335-page book, "Flip That Coin -- We're Ready," by Wilmington college football coach Bill Ramseyer. He was head coach here in 1961-62. He went on to Firelands and then to Brunswick before going to Missouri.

Just published by Lucas Brothers Publishers of Columbia, Mo., the book represents nearly five years of creative effort on the part of Ramseyer, who guided the Quakers to a 5-4 season.

Dan Devine, head coach and general manager of the Green Bay Packers, calls the book "the coach's dictionary, almanac, and encyclopedia wrapped into one. Where, as the content deals directly with the high school program, there are organizational and motivational ideas that are applicable to the college or professional coach or even to coaches of other sports."

Ramseyer wrote the book to fill a void. "So many coaching books are merely concerned with the X's and O's, the offensive and defensive plays, rather than taking a how-to approach toward actually setting up a football program," said Ramseyer.

"The book enables someone to pick up the book, start from day one, and follow the directions daily, weekly, and monthly in sequence. There are checklists about everything -- I'm a nut about

checklists. Each year, I'd update my checklists and I'd start the season at least as well-organized as where I finished last year," he added.

The table of contents is arranged with monthly subtitles. January, for example, offers the following: "stationery, birthday and anniversary cards, baby contracts, player personnel files, staff meeting agendas and minutes, gimmicks for squad, student body and community, football newsletters, Booster club organization, budgeting and ordering equipment."

Another exotic item incorporated by Ramseyer is Ladies' Clinic. It's not what you might think. It's an evening scheduled for women only, so that they can ask any questions about football without the risk of embarrassment. They can become more knowledgeable spectators in this way," said Ramseyer.

If the table of contents is any gauge, a coach is busiest in August, when he's concerned with 'let-
