Village council voted Tuesday night to give power of attorney to a Cleveland accountant to appeal the pending violation of Phase II of the Economic Stabilization program...

Solicitor Robert A. McKown said Baumgarten & Co., Cleveland, would be able to handle the village's appeal to allow two pay raises over the 5.5 per cent set by law...

Councilman Hugh W. Washburn proposed that while the village's appeal is pending, the two ordinances raising the salaries of the village administrator from \$8,500 to \$10,000...

The village has 10 days in Cleveland to file its case in court before the appeal is allowed to proceed.

Approval was given to a contract between the solicitor and the village. McKown set his fee for the legal work connected with the proposed sewer system at two per cent although up to four per cent is allowable by law.

It was passed as an emergency measure in order to apply for federal funds to provide a vehicle. The problem of paid holidays, which has plagued the council for several months, was tabled until a new pay ordinance is established. This cannot be written until the outcome of the village appeal to IRS is known, since the salary committee did not plan to stay at the required 5.5 per cent raise in some cases.

Clerk Quentin R. Ream asked how he should handle the village payroll. In the past checks have been written to employees before the finance committee actually had approved the payroll, depending on when the council meetings occurred.

Plymouth drew to within a point of the visitors midway through the second period. With the score 24 to 23 in the Minutemen's favor, a free throw by Dave Pigman, who was to score 10 points, sent the visitors into a lead they never relinquished.

COACH JOHN BARR'S crew steadily drew away from that point. Lexington employed a press against Plymouth for part of the first half and it, as always, succeeded. No Plymouth team for several seasons has been consistently able to cope with a press and this one is no exception.

And it is clear that it was the press and the fast break that did it, because the Minutemen did not control the boards. In fact, the Big Red outbounded its opponent, 41 to 36. Lee Wilkins took down 12 and Bill Van Wagner 10.

Lexington shot extremely well. It got off 58 tries at the basket and converted 32, a strong 55 per cent, and it averaged 20 points a period, or roughly a point each time it obtained possession.

Conversely, on its own floor, Plymouth did not shoot so well. Its record was 17 of 56, only 30 per cent. Plymouth missed too many free throws for a

team playing at home. It made only 20 of 32 tries. Lexington missed 10 of 26.

# 'Are you willing?' asks Auntie, to say some words of praise?

This comes from the Wellington Enterprise, and I think it is worth passing on:

**ARE YOU WILLING?**  
To close your book of complaints and to open the book of praise?

To believe other men are as sincere as you and to treat them with respect?

To ignore what life owes you and think about what you owe life?  
To stop looking for friendship and to start being friendly?

To be content with such things as you have and to stop whining for the things you do not have?

To enjoy the simplest things of life and cease striving for the artificial pleasure of the day?

To forget what you have accomplished and meditate on what others have done for you?

To cease looking for someone to help you and to devote yourself to helping others?

Is there anymore to say? We all need something like this once in a while to perk us up, it may not be great literature, but it does hit home. This is what life is really all about.

After you have given this a little thought, you deserve a little diversion, so carefully close yourself up in your kitchen. It is the fun room in any house.

Now that you are completely alone, carefully approach your refrigerator, open it slowly and peek in and see what you have. This can be a real shock. What can you do with a head of lettuce, one canned ham, some candied green and red cherries, a carton of cottage cheese and some assorted things like mustard, chutney, catsup, milk and a few more ordinary things refrigerators hold?

Then you open the top and what do you find there? A package of frozen sole filets, a bag of frozen shrimp and a package of beef filets.

This doesn't leave too much choice for a meal, but it can be done. It is one of those one-dish deals because hopefully there should be the other things in the cupboards. So down on your hands and knees to scrounge through the shelves.

Any normally equipped kitchen can produce a one-dish if the shrimp is there.

If you have no shrimp,

then trot out for some, but, please, buy the better kind. It may cost a little more, but it is worth it, and besides the total cost per person of this is quite cheap compared to what meat for guests would cost. When I say "for guests", that means we show off a little and buy something we really wouldn't for every-day eating. This will serve six people with a salad, rolls and dessert.

Chop up a half cup each of onion and green pepper and mince one clove of garlic. Sauté in a fourth cup of margarine. Butter might give a speck more flavor but not that much. Add a cup of rice (uncooked), a pound can of tomatoes, three fourths cups of bouillon made with two chicken cubes, a teaspoon of salt and a half teaspoon of Tabasco sauce. Bring it all to a boil, then turn it down, covered, and let it simmer about 20 minutes or until the rice looks cooked and is not too liquidy.

Add a pound of cleaned, cooked shrimp. If they are large ones, cut them in half. If you happen to have any leftover ham, it can be added too. But if you don't, you still have a lovely dish. What can really perk it up is a sprinkling, good sized, of grated cheese, or if you are really wealthy, bits of toasted almonds.

Next week we all weight watch, which will ruin the whole time, but is necessary.

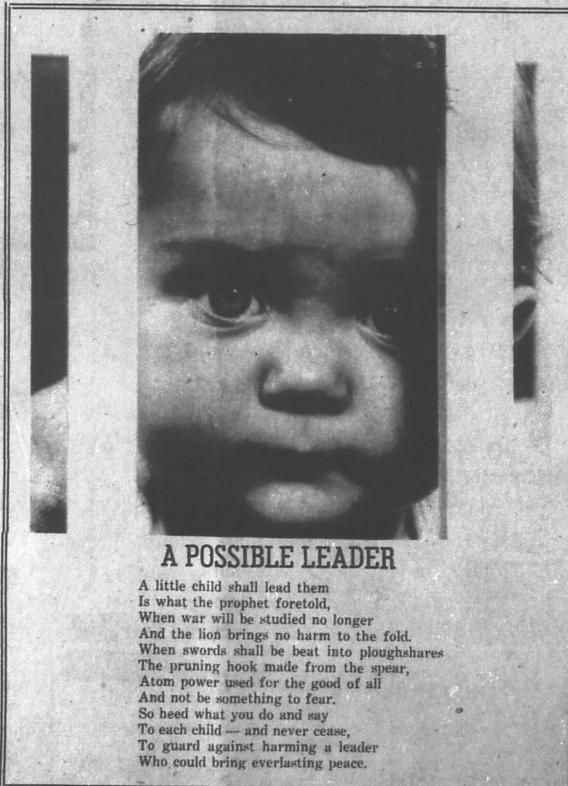

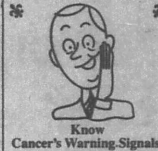
