Sift about a fourth of a cup of flour over the mixture to thicken it, then roll into balls. These then become liver dumplings. Drop them into boiling beef broth and cook. On rice, they are good. Cheap too, and this can make you a real witch with the family budget.

Stir in some finely chopped onion and the tops of fresh celery, about a tablespoon of melted butter, salt, pepper, a dash of dill and either nutmeg or sage.

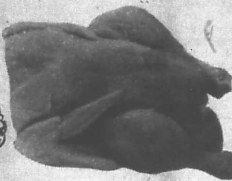

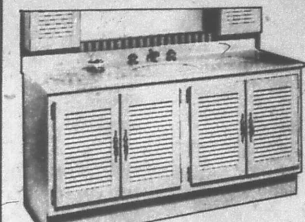

Sec. 4801.22 (a) has been revised to allow minors 18 years old to handle intoxicating liquors in sealed containers in connection with wholesale and retail sales or in open containers, with certain restrictions, in connection with a food service operation. Persons between 18 and 21 may now handle sealed containers in a retail sales operation such as a carry-out super market by loading or unloading shipments, stocking shelves or checking and carrying out purchases for customers (a long-

standing custom despite the fact the law until recently prohibited it). They may also handle open containers within a food service operation such as a restaurant, in connection with cleaning tables or handling empty bottles, cans or glasses. But a waiter or waitress must still be 21 to take an order for any intoxicating liquor.
