ORDINANCE NO. 19-72A AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL, VILLAGE OF PLYMOUTH, OHIO, ESTABLISHING THE POSI-

POSITION OF CLERK-DISPATCHER OF THE AMBULANCE DEPARTMENT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL, VILLAGE OF PLYMOUTH, OHIO, THAT:

SECTION 1: There is hereby established the position of Clerk-Dispatcher under the Ambulance Department, Village of Plymouth, in accordance with the provisions of Ordinance No. 72-72A.

SECTION 2: The Clerk-Dispatcher shall be under the direct supervision of the Chief of the Ambulance Department of the Village of Plymouth, Ohio, but shall be appointed to said office until confirmed by the Village of Plymouth, Ohio, but shall not perform the functions of said office until confirmed by the Village of Plymouth, Ohio, (2/3) vote of the members of the legislative body. The appointment by the Mayor shall be in writing and the confirmation of the legislative body shall be by motion.

SECTION 3: The salary of the Clerk-Dispatcher of the Ambulance Department shall be \$1,000 per annum payable from the General Fund of the Village of Plymouth, Ohio, in semi-monthly installments.

SECTION 4: The Clerk-Dispatcher of the Ambulance Department shall perform such clerical duties as may be assigned by the Chief of the Ambulance Department or the Mayor of the Village of Plymouth, as upon recommendation of the legislative body and Chairman of the Ambulance Committee, and shall include, the following:

1. Maintain an account, separate and apart from all other accounts, showing income derived from all sources for and on behalf of the Ambulance Department, together with a detailed and itemized list of the expenditures incurred in the operation of said service.
2. Forward a statement, computed in accordance with Ordinance No. 17-72A, to each person or his or her personal representative receiving services from the Plymouth Ambulance Department and the same shall be forward within ten (10) days from date of rendition of service.
3. Receive calls from persons requesting ambulance service and dispatching personnel and equipment in the manner prescribed by the Chief of Ambulance Department or the Mayor as upon recommendation of the legislative body and the Chairman of the Ambulance Committee.
4. To remit all income received for and on behalf of the Ambulance Department to the Clerk of the Village of Plymouth, Ohio, for deposit in the General Fund of said village.
5. To render an accounting to the legislative body of the Village at the first meeting of each month.

SECTION 5: Nothing within this ordinance shall prevent or preclude the Clerk-Dispatcher of the Ambulance Department from simultaneously serving in the position of Clerk-Dispatcher of the Ambulance Department and Clerk of the Village of Plymouth, Ohio, nor from simultaneously holding the position of Clerk-Dispatcher of the Police Department as established in Ordinance No. 22-62 if duly appointed and confirmed to said positions as set forth in Section 2 of this ordinance.

SECTION 6: This ordinance is an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the health, welfare and safety of the public and shall go into effect immediately, the reason for the emergency being that the appointment of the Clerk is necessary for the operation of the Ambulance Department, which is necessary for the protection of the lives of the people of said Village.

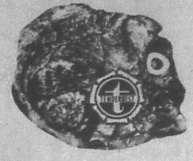
