11 stolen cars recovered in Huron county

Eleven motor vehicles, valued at \$28,000, were recovered last week within a 16-mile radius of Willard, Huron County Sheriff's deputies reported.

Sergeant Lloyd Smith said 10 of the 11 vehicles had altered or replaced vehicle identification numbers.

Smith said the persons and dealers who bought the stolen vehicles possessed certificates of title that matched the new identification but did not match the vehicles.

Source of the facts in the investigation was Columbus Police department and Franklin County Sheriff's department, Smith said.

On Apr. 2 he was given information from Columbus that stolen vehicles in Huron County.

Biggest loser in the deal: Sunshine's Motor Sales, Route 224, Willard, which may be out for \$3,000 to \$6,000 for "cars purchased from other dealers," whom Dave Immon, brother of the proprietor, refused to identify. Three cars are involved.

Whether the ambulance should be permitted to transport a patient beyond original Shelby Memorial Area hospital after an emergency call will be discussed by the council with the trustees of Plymouth and New Haven townships.

A resolution to authorize the clerk to advertise sale of mortgage revenue bonds to finance County's debt for sanitary sewer system was approved.

A new cleaning woman, Mrs. James Reffert, found a packet of pot under the cushion of the chair habitually occupied by Councilman Frank R. Garber, who doesn't even smoke tobacco.

Police surmise the cache was put there by a worried teenager summoned to the council chamber by Chief Robert L. Meiser to talk about use of and/or possession of drugs of another type.

"Perhaps," observes Meiser, "that teenager and I think I remember who it was -- thought we were going to make a search right there?"
