Halls burned out again, second time during 1976

For the second time in two months, the Delmas Hall family has been burned out.

On Apr. 13, Shiloh Fire department was summoned at 8:16 p. m. to the home of Wayne Deskins,

West Main street, Shiloh, where the apartment of the Halls was engulfed in flames.

The fire in the north-eastern part of the house was confined by the firemen to three rooms of the apartment, completely destroying a bedroom and kitchen and partly burning a second bedroom.

Plymouth Fire department responded to a mutual aid call for more air

tanks. Cause of the fire is unknown. An undetermined amount of damage was done.

The Halls and the Deskins escaped without injuries. Hall was an occupant of the old Spear house in Plymouth when it burned on Feb. 6.

Dr. Wolford wants to quit

Veteran Richland County Coroner Dr. Robert Wolford has second thoughts about seeking reelection.

The Republican incumbent has petitioned the county board of elections to withdraw as a GOP candidate in the June 8 primary.

But his application was received after the deadline to withdraw. The board of elections met Monday to consider the request.

Wolford has been coroner 12 years. He says the job is too time consuming and as he hasn't an free time, he can't have any free time.

Wolford will remain as county health commissioner. If his withdrawal is approved, Dr. Raymond Thabet would be the only GOP candidate for the post. Dr. Gordon Morkel is the Democratic nominee.

Councilmen approved appointments of the three members of Mary Faye park board. Robert A. Clasen will serve a four year term effective Jan. 1, 1976; Wayne H. Strine, three years, and Eldon Burkett, two years.

Ordinance 30-61 set the terms. Since 1961, the members were reappointed sporadically. A search of village records revealed that Lewis was never officially reappointed since his first appointment in the 1950s, that Strine was appointed in 1972 for a four year term and that Burkett was appointed to serve the term of his late father, Omer G. Burkett, in 1969 for six years.

Councilman D. Douglas Brumbach, committee man for the park board, said the council had no significant vandalism in the park during the winter months. He also reported the board reappointed Wayne Seibert as custodian for the coming year.

Mayor Elizabeth G. Paddock read a recommendation from McKinley Roofing, Inc., Mansfield, that a new roof be installed on the firehouse at a cost of \$5,250. She said the council had heard around for several years knowing it needs repair and did nothing.

Councilman James L. Jacobs, Sr., said the fault was entirely that of Fire Chief Judson A. Morrison, who had taken no action to get it done. One-time Jacobs suggested the firemen undertake the necessary repairs. The question arose of whether they would be

Sam Pry lost one game in a straight set win over Roehder.

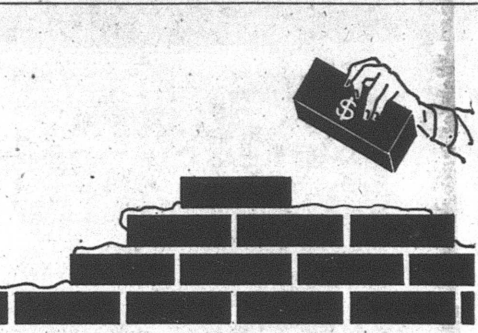
And Steve Cook lost a game in the first set in a straight set triumph over Hader.
