

Water status? At 45¢ a cup?

Mink, pearls, orchids and diamonds have been real status symbols for as long as most of us can remember.

Now they are being replaced by something which has been around much longer. You will never guess. It's water. Water has become extremely fashionable, but not in the way we all know.

Turn on a faucet and there it is, or it is pouring down rain and your basement is a mess.

Those who are the real pacemakers do not bother with it in such forms. No, they go out and buy it in bottles or even order it in a restaurant. It is very special stuff that comes from various springs around the world that have been famous health spas for centuries.

The thing that makes it different from water going through a municipal system is that it is plain hard, and water authorities say this is what we should all be drinking, not water that has been through a softening system.

One expert says that softening water began about 50 years ago when it was found that softened water saved on soap and kept pipes from scaling, thus saving money for industries such as laundries and other big water users. People are not big water users at all when it comes to drinking it.

There is another thing, too, about softened water: the sodium content is increased, which is not good for people, especially those with heart conditions. Sodium also causes retention of body fluids.

If you own a natural spring, you are plain lucky, since it is becoming big business. Take care of it and do not let any pollutants touch it. Someone told me a few years ago that good moonshine was hard to come by because the streams and springs were becoming so polluted.

I kind of wonder what will happen to water systems and what it will taste like after the Safe Drinking Water act that Congress passed in 1974 and is thoroughly implemented by the Environmental Protection Agency. Now they tell us how it should be treated. It is tested daily and must

pass their standards, even though everyone complains about how it tastes and smells.

RIGHT NOW WE ARE really riding the gravy train for what we pay for our water. And since bottled water costs about 45 cents for a little over a cupful, we will have to keep turning on the faucet to get a drink. Imported water costs even more.

This is her newest recipe for zucchini bread.

First grate enough zucchini, skin and all, to make two cups. Then beat three eggs until foamy and gradually add two cups of sugar. Then add two-thirds of a cup of vegetable oil and the zucchini.

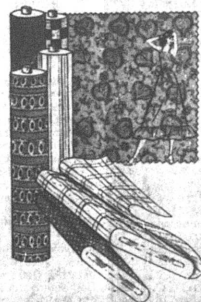

Juvenile division classes are entitled "Posie Pickin' Time", for arrangements in a farm toy by exhibitors under 10, and "The Old Swimming Hole", for arrangements displaying water, for exhibitors over 10 but under 17.

Horticultural classes are for single specimens of all seasonal flowers. A potted plant exhibition is also planned.
