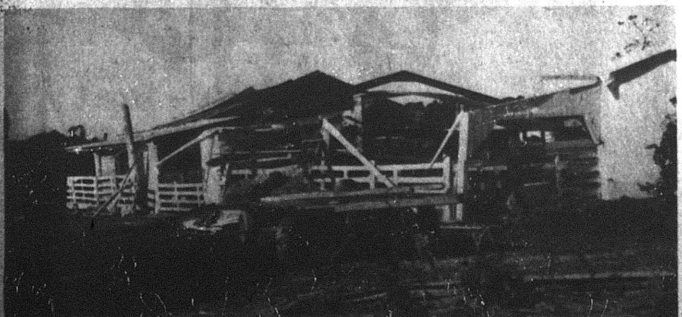

insist it was a tornado, but other weather experts say it wasn't -- that swept across northern Richland county, Ashland county and Sandusky county Thursday evening.

But Shiloh and Shelby sustained heavy damage. And so did Fremont, the county seat of Sandusky county, where damage has been estimated as high as \$12 million.

Some eyewitnesses told The Advertiser they saw twisters. Milton E. Mellett, who lives on the Bachrach farm in Route 603 east of Plymouth, said he sat on his porch and "watched three of them."

The high winds struck here about 8:10 p. m. Thereafter there was heavy rain.

Earlier, the storm struck Sulphur Springs in Crawford county. Shelby was hard hit, notably in the west section of the city. Mayor Henry Cline said he couldn't begin to estimate the damage.

In Plymouth, the damage was slight. A huge maple tree between United Methodist church and the police station was felled, cutting electric service in the immediate section. Village workers worked through the night to restore current by 7:50 a. m. the next day.

Another great tree on the Lummy Sexton property in Nichols avenue was uprooted, disrupting power service. Some trees in Sandusky street near the high school came down. And the roof of Dr. Vacy's Dragunas's residence in Route 603 at the village limits was raised and lowered in place.

The storm howled on to the east. It had earlier struck the barn of Charles Myers, who lives on the old Woodhouse farm in Route 98, and destroyed six of a stable of 11 draft horses. The barn was leveled and the horses driven into the ground so they were all but buried alive.

THE BARN ON THE Myers property measured 40 x 60 feet.

Four of the animals killed were registered Belgians. The others were grade horses.

Each was valued at about

\$2,000 apiece.

There was no one home when the wind struck. Myers was at work at Midwest Industries, Ind., Willard, where he is a welder. His wife and a son, Leonard, 10, were visiting in Shiloh. A second son, Gordon, 16, went to visit a third brother, Gary, in Willard.

When the tornado struck again, it was at Route 603 and Bowman Street road. A house at Opdyke road and Bowman Street road was hard hit. The storm crossed the road and reduced the sheep barn on the Kranz property in Route 603 to splinters.

The Kranz property across the road, formerly occupied by the Forrest Van Wagners, was badly damaged. The house east of it, in the north side of Route 603, owned and occupied by the Stone family, lost the east wing and two vehicles housed in it.

Here the eye of the storm moved northeast. Next it struck a trailer occupied by the Buddy Sextons in the west side of Euclid street. The trailer was hurled from its foundation and into the brickyard pond across the road.

The storm continued eastward to the Shepherd property in the north side of Noble road, west of the railroad tracks. Giant pines that had stood for a century were snapped off like matchsticks. The upper story of the Shepherd house was blown off. And a trailer occupied by Margaret Shephard, east of the main house, was reduced to junk.

Wayne Hunter reported an Amish neighbor who had a barn raising only a few days before the storm will need another. The storm sped on to Savannah, destroying store fronts and laying a dozen splendid trees in waste across the roadway.

Miraculously, there were no injuries reported.

Police sounded the village siren when the tree fell in front of police headquarters. Mayor Elizabeth G. Paddock reported by car to police headquarters at once and when she found wires

down in Dix street, she returned the car to its garage and walked in a driving rain to the Square to supervise emergency activities. Firemen managed to start a generator and provide illumination until power was restored. The outage was for about an hour.

SHILOH'S WATER AND sewer supply was interrupted by the storm. The roof blew off the pumping station at the water plant. Russell J. Moser, retired utilities superintendent here whose roots trace to Shiloh, reported he managed to connect the water pumps so that a supply could be pumped directly without treatment.

But power was out until late Monday.

Mayor Grady McDonald estimated damages in the fire district at \$300,000. Some householders, threatened by loss of frozen foods, took them to Mansfield and to Plymouth, beginning Friday.

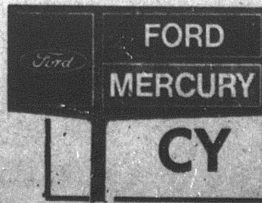

What about the four churches and numerous organizations in town? I didn't see any of them offering help of any kind to the people who were hit the hardest by the tornado. As a matter of fact, my wife called the president of the Fire Belles, which is an organization of wives of the firemen, and asked if they would like to help. Her reply was she didn't think it was their place to help out, and if anyone wanted to help it should be the neighbors. She also stated that it was the 4th of July weekend and a lot of people were going away for the week-end.

My wife and a few good neighbors, very few, took it upon themselves to furnish food and drink to the very few that were cleaning up the mess caused by the tornado.

I have heard that we might get a cleanup crew composed of OCS inmates tomorrow. Who needs them? Most of the mess is cleaned up by now and we sure don't need a bunch of convicts running around Shiloh.

Fortunately for the victims, most of them had relatives to take them in. I didn't see anyone out from the Red Cross until July 3, three days after the tornado hit.

Shiloh is supposed to have one of the best disaster plans in the county and I understand that the county may make Shiloh's plan as a model for the rest of the county.

The plan can only be as good as the people who make it.

The boy got the idea for staging the event while watching TV personality Jerry Lewis.

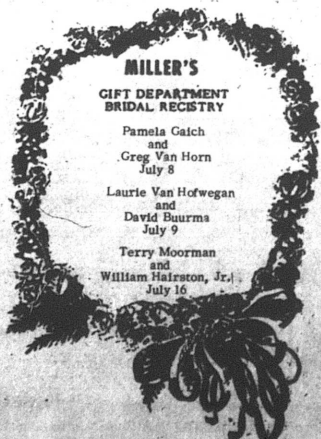

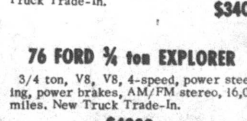
