

## Scuffle with trespasser ends in death of man, 62

A 29-year-old Willard route 2 man was charged with involuntary manslaughter Sunday evening after he scuffled with the owner of a quarry in Route 598, New Haven township.

Silas Slone was lodged in Huron county jail by sheriff's deputies, who were called at 6 p. m.

Slone is said to have been trespassing on the quarry owned by Wilbur Hersher, 62, who died as a result of an altercation with Slone.

Hersher noticed the trespasser and went to the site to order them off.

A dispute ensued. Slone was dead on arrival in the Plymouth ambulance at Willard Area hospital.

Born Apr. 30, 1917, in Seneca county, Mr. Hersher lived his whole life in New Haven township. He was the son of Chester H. and Estella Hutchison Hersher. He was a retired farmer.

## '42 grad killed in crash

A 54-year-old Plymouth native was killed Friday night when his car left a road near Lexington, struck a tree and burst into flames.

Gerald E. Scott was trapped in the wreckage of his 1973 Corvette. Troy Township Fire department required two hours to free his body from the vehicle, which went off the right side of Graham road about 2 1/2 miles north of Lexington, hit a drain tile and a small tree, then flew into the air and struck another tree before exploding in flame.

The collision occurred shortly after 10 p. m.

The dead man was the son of Byron and Ingeba Scott. He had lived in Shelby before he moved to Lexington in 1964. He was an electrician in the Fisher Body plant of General Motors Corp., Ontario, for 16 years.

He was graduated by Plymouth High school in 1942.

## Volunteer guards needed

Police Chief W. Robert Seal with the cooperation of the Friends of Shiloh is setting up a guard crossing patrol for the 1979-80 school years.
