A section of the ordinance was changed to read that "The credit shall not exceed 50 per cent of the tax assessed by this ordinance on such net profit, salary, wages, commissions or compensation earned in such other municipalities or municipalities where such tax is paid."

The amount of 50 per cent was inserted. This means that a Plymouth resident working in another municipality paying a one per cent tax there will only pay half of that amount here. His municipal income tax there would be 1 1/2 per cent, as opposed to one per cent paid by his neighbor who works in the village.

In other action the council accepted the resignation of Mrs. William Wheeler, which was to be effective Friday.

Mayor Elizabeth G. Paddock suggested it be tabled, but Moore moved to accept it, all members agreeing. Meanwhile, Mrs. Wheeler has asked for a special meeting with the council.

Schools plan record budget

A record budget of \$1,943,500 for 1980 was approved by Plymouth Board of Education Monday night.

The budget anticipates a deficit of \$29,871.61 by year's end.

Receipts are anticipated to be \$1,913,628.39, of which 69 per cent derives from outside the district.

Film center at Norwalk in operation

Huron County Microfilming center is in full operation, reports John A. Elminger, recorder, its director.

Late in March, the county commissioners, after discussing the benefits of microfilming with Clerk of Courts Clark Hunter and Recorder Elminger, created the center to provide microfilming services for all county offices.

The commissioners allocated \$10,000 for the purchase of additional equipment and supplies for the center. Four thousand dollars was added to the recorder's budget for the salary of the filming technician for the remainder of 1979. Recorder Elminger was appointed director of the center and is responsible for its operation.

While supplies are being furnished for the remainder of this year, starting in 1980, each participating county office will be responsible for purchasing its own film.

Documents on microfilm require much less storage space than in their original form. As many as 2,000 documents can be placed on a four inch roll of film. Security microfilm is used in vaults provides security from fire or any other catastrophe that could destroy the original document.

County offices now involved with having their records microfilmed include commissioners, clerk of courts, auditor, probate and juvenile courts, engineer and recorder. Other offices have also expressed interest in the county microfilming system.

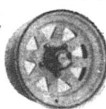

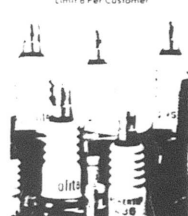
