Ream, Neeley score 52, Red downs Christian, 64-56

Jeff Ream did to Mansfield Christian school in the second half here Saturday what Randy Neeley did in the first half and Plymouth won its fourth consecutive home game, 64 to 56.

Plymouth squandered a halftime lead during the third period, when Neeley was limited to a single free throw attempt, which he missed, and went into the last eight minutes trailing by three points to 50 to 47.

Ream, who was held to nine shots in the first half and eight points, two of them coming on free throws, went to work. The 6'4", 120 lb. forward came back to the squad in the seventh game, had bagged four field goals in as many shots during the third quarter. He scored two free throws at 6:47, a field goal at 6:14, and two more free throws at 5:37 to establish a lead that Plymouth never forsok.

With the score at 53 to 50, Mike Haring threw in a jumper from the key to cut the lead to one, whereupon Ream fired another jumper and Neeley did likewise. From here on it was like picking cherries in August.

Both teams shot exceptionally well. And they were evenly matched otherwise. Plymouth had more opportunities at the foul line, 20 to 14, but each team missed eight tries.

Christian unloaded for field goal 60 times and made 25 of them. Plymouth's record was slightly better, it shot 55 times and scored with 26.

Christian made 15 turnovers, Plymouth only 12. Plymouth outrebounded the Flames, 36 to 32. Each team had 13 assists and five steals.

Ream's 28 points led all scorers. Neeley contributed 24.

For the visitors, a plucky team, Jeff McBride scored 23 and Bob Kiamy 11.

Only five players on each side got onto the scoreboard.

Ontario decks Red in return match

Anybody who paid to see the Ontario vs. Plymouth basketball game at Ontario Friday night must've felt he was robbed.

Neither team played the game that it's capable of and the Warriors emerged with revenge for an earlier loss at Plymouth.

The score was 54 to 43. The game was marked by mistake after mistake, on both sides. Plymouth was charged with 22 turnovers, Ontario with 17.

And neither team shot at all well. Ontario unloaded for field goal 54 times and was successful with only 19. Plymouth's performance was no less satisfactory: 47 shots, 17 successes. Each team missed too many free throws, Ontario 11 of 27, Plymouth eight of 17.

One Plymouth player, Scott Harris, a starter, fouled out. And when the final horn sounded, there were five others in deep trouble with four apiece. These were Randy Neeley, Brad Postema, Jeff Ream, Rob Smith and Steve Tackett.

Plymouth kept it close until three minutes were gone in the final period. This is when Ontario began to pull away. It opened a seven point lead on a shot off the end line by Paul Morrow and a key field goal on an inbound play by Kevin Ellison, who led all scorers with 20. Plymouth countered with a field goal by Jeff Ream from 18 feet out, but then Ontario struck together four unanswered points and the Warriors had a lead of 45 to 36 with 2:36 remaining. Plymouth could not close the gap thereafter.

Ream, who was held to a single shot in the first period, when Plymouth managed only four points, led the Big Red with 14. Neeley had 12. No other Plymouth player was in double figures.

Ellison was the only Warrior to score more than eight points.

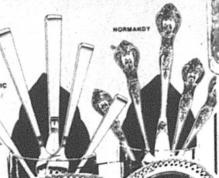

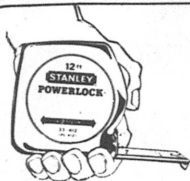
