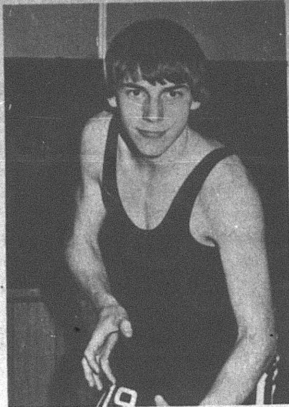
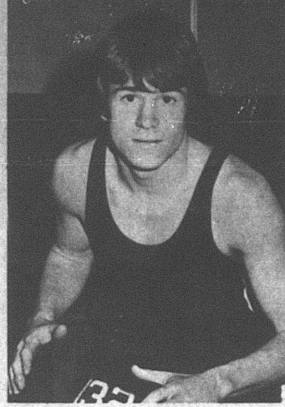




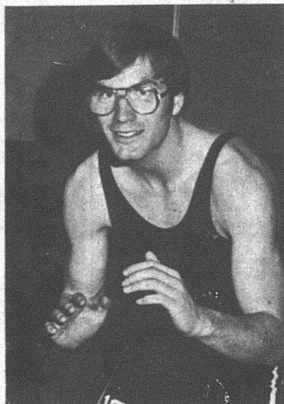

Blankenship captures sectional championship

Gary Blankenship became the third sectional wrestling champion in Plymouth High school's history at Vermilion Saturday when he won the 145-pound title by defeating Jim Kutney, St. Peter's, 13 to 9.

En route, Blankenship disposed of Tim Klingshirm, Western Reserve; Cox, New London, and Mower, Tiffin Calvert.

He goes to the district tourney at Bowling Green State university this week with a 24-and-3 record with 21 pins.

Five other wrestlers will compete in the district, the largest contingent Plymouth has ever sent to district competition.

These are Mike Stima, fourth, 105-lb. class, Pete Daron, second, 112-lb. class, Dale Moorman, fourth, 119-lb. class, Bill Hudson, fourth, 132-lb. class, and Jeff Burrer, fourth, 175-lb. division.

They helped Plymouth take third place in team scoring, with 130½ team points. St. Mary's, undefeated in wrestling as in basketball, swamped the field with 248. New London was next with 190. Behind Plymouth came Seneca East at 115½, St. Paul's at 100½, Crestview at 87½, St. Peter's at 83, Tiffin Calvert at 72½, Western Reserve at 66, Buckeye Central at 52 and Monroeville at 15½.

Stima pinned Rogers, Western Reserve, and decisioned Bob Jones, Monroeville, Friday night. In the semi-finals, he lost to Steve Strimpfel, St. Paul's, 12 to 1. Strimpfel went on to win the class.

In the consolation bouts, Stima beat Goodin, Crestview, 4 to 0 but lost to John Corso, St. Mary's, 4 to 1. His record is now 15-and-6.

Daron pinned Steel, St. Peter's, and then defeated Bret Hokes, St. Paul's, and Jamie Wolf, Crestview. He lost in the finals to Jeff Law, St. Mary's, 9 to 8. His record is now 15-1-1.

Moorman started out by beating Crump, Western Reserve, 3 to 1, in overtime.

He lost to Ed Young, St. Paul's, the eventual champion, but came back to trim Kline, Crestview, 3 to 0 before going down to Pat Waldock, Seneca East, 4 to 3. His slate is now 15-and-6.

Hudson defeated Pat Smith, Tiffin Calvert, 13 to 7 and pinned Gerry Phillips, Seneca East, on Friday night. He lost to the ultimate winner, Tim Beverick, St.

Wynford ousted Plymouth from the Class A playdowns in girls' basketball at New Washington Feb. 27.

The score was 54 to 44. The Royals won it at the foul line, where they made 16 of 30 tries. Plymouth had only 12 shots and made half of them.

Plymouth led by two after eight minutes, only to be all but blown from the floor in the second period, when Wynford outscored Plymouth by a dozen.

The Big Red matched the Royals shot for shot in the second half but couldn't cut into the lead.

Renee Taylor led Plymouth with 13 points. Cheri Harrer and Karen Rittersbach scored 16 points apiece to lead the Royals.

It was Plymouth's third meeting of the season with Wynford, which won all of them.

Wynford controlled the offensive boards. Overall, the Royals took down 44 rebounds, Plymouth only 25. Turnovers were almost even.

Wynford with 27, Plymouth 26.

Each team scored 19 field

goals, the Royals with 63 shots, Plymouth with 52.

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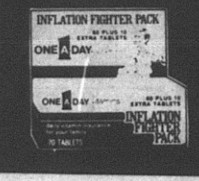
