

Two teachers quit posts

Two teachers resigned Monday night.

Kathy Bell, kindergarten teacher at Shiloh, will leave Ohio.

Vicki L. Stuckert, high school learning disabilities teacher, resigned for personal reasons.

Each resignation was accepted.

By three to two vote, the board of education rejected a request by Cheryl Warner to complete a required course in problems of democracy during the summer to avoid having to attend classes next year. She would graduate normally in 1981. Miss Warner said in her application she will be compelled to quit school if her request were denied.

Larry O. Vredenburg and A. George Miller supported the request. Mrs. Roger Pugh, Don M. Eichelberger and the Rev. Arthur H. Hamman rejected it.

Twenty applicants have said they want the head coaching job in boys' basketball. None is presently on the staff. Staff Douglas Stages said "from a third to a half of the applicants are presently head coaches". Screening of the candidates will eliminate 15 of them; the final five will be interviewed by the athletic committee — Vredenburg and Miller — and the superintendent, the high school principal, James Craycraft, and the athletic director, Sam Cook.

Michael McFarren, Dalton, former teacher and head football coach here, will address the Class of 1980 on June 1. So will Karen Russell, a member of the class.

A request by the parents of Andrew Niedermeier to release him to attend St. Bernard's school at New Washington through the eighth grade was approved.

High school girls were

authorized to participate in a summer basketball league involving 10 schools. About 10 local girls have shown interest in participating. State rules require that no more than two girls from a single school may play on a given team.

Keith Diebler was authorized to organize a summer boys' and girls' basketball camp. Boys' camp will be from June 9 through 23, girls' from July 14 through 28.

A contract with Willard Taxi Co. to transport three handicapped pupils to classes in Mansfield was renewed for one year at an increase of \$1 a pupil a day.

Signs are that Wednesdays will be reserved for pupils wishing to participate in church activities during the 1980-81 school year.

"New Dimensions in Music" is the title of a new textbook approved for use in grades kindergarten through seven.

Francis Snyder and Bettie Sheller were approved as substitute bus drivers for the remainder of the year.

Pupils of vocational agriculture were authorized to purchase a used combine, probably for \$7,500. The board must appropriate \$1,300 to match a federal grant and other funds available from outside the district. Earnings in the farm fund will pay the remainder of the bill.

A total of 108 candidates for the diploma was approved, subject to satisfactory completion of requirements.

Kenneth Bailey was hired as custodian of the high school for May and June and Jody Kissinger as cleaner in Plymouth Elementary school until the end of the term.

Mrs. Eric J. Akers was accorded maternity leave without pay for one year. She is an elementary teacher at Shiloh.

A gag by mayor? Some employees object to order to cease talking about village business

An informal order by Eric J. Akers to all village employees issued Friday has touched off some objection among some of them.

They label it a gag order. Akers forbade any employee of the village from discussing village business with other than village staff, on pain of dismissal.

Three of them have engaged a lawyer, Thomas L. Root, Washington, D. C., to represent them. They allege the order violates their First Amendment rights. It is understood that after conversations between Root and Akers Monday, action to enter federal district court at Cleveland yesterday with a request for a temporary restraining order has been suspended "for about 30 days" to give Akers time to soften the language and clarify his intent.

What touched it off?

Akers is close-mouthed about it and won't

surrender a copy of the informal order to The Advertiser. He says "it's been blown up out of all proportion". What he apparently wants is to prevent village employees from engaging in "idle gossip and speculation" about matters that are or may be the subject of court action.

The inference here is that Akers has heard stories that some village personnel have been discussing the merits of the case of Mrs. Dorothy Digion Miles against the village, seeking heavy damages on grounds of negligence in the death of her first husband, a fireman, Dec. 19, 1976.

Who are Root's clients? He says he can't disclose their names because to do so would destroy the confidentiality of the lawyer-client relationship. He acknowledged one of them is a "volunteer" and one of them is a CETA employee.

How to meet May 16 payroll? Red ink total \$103,760, CPA tells council

Final report of Peter Roache given village council Tuesday night shows fund deficits of \$103,760.51 versus the \$160,000 he quoted last week.

The electric fund has bounced back to a balance of \$54,922.11 with collections for the first four months of this year, which wipes out the deficit, but the fund owes Ohio Power Co. a total of \$39,162.37.

The general fund has recouped a bit, but still is in a deficit of some \$37,599.26.

Mayor Eric J. Akers said this is a big village problem.

The police payroll has been

drastically cut from \$457,698 in January to \$335,700 in February, from \$3,315.96 to \$2,261.80 in April.

The current payroll due is \$1,671.40, which is the lowest since the first March payroll, which was \$1,519.24.

The council did not see its way clear to authorize the next payroll, which amounts to \$5,108.33. This necessitated adjourning the meeting until yesterday at 8 a.m. when arrangement would be under way to ask for a tax advance from the Richland county auditor with the hope his office will be open at that

hour.

The clerk-treasurer, who has not been paying current bills, has been putting receipts into short time deposits and at this point the village has earned about \$1,400 in interest.

The clerk, Mrs. Bobbie McGee, when asked by Councilman David A. Howard, stated she thinks after the next collection in the water fund, that fund will be in the black and the street fund should also show a balance because of the sale of license plates. As of now the street fund is \$618.21 in the red.

May 9 payroll met from revenue sharing

Federal revenue sharing

funds will be used to meet Friday's payroll, village council ruled Thursday.

Clerk-Treasurer Bobbie McGee certified to the mayor and council that the park, income tax, and cemetery funds were the only ones without a deficit, and she would not touch any of the others until the deficit balances have been resolved.

Peter Roache, certified public accountant hired by the village, told the council that he has brought the village books showing balances and deficits through Dec. 31, 1979, but that he did not make any adjustments from fund to fund. He said in a written statement that he did the work from figures furnished him by the clerk, the mayor and several other village employees.

Roache said he thought the total deficit amounts to \$160,000 as of the end of last year.

He also pointed out that he found inadequate record keeping and could not find evidence that federal and state withholding taxes had been forwarded.

The mayor appointed Councilman G. Thomas Moore to head the finance committee, replacing Councilman Mrs. Allan Raymond, who has resigned, although her resignation has not been formally accepted by the council.

The mayor then appointed Councilman Dean A. Cline to the committee.

Today examiners are expected to look at the village books to determine if the village has a true fiscal

emergency as House Bill 138 calls for.

Village Administrator James C. Root again had said news to tell the water problem.

It is to call George Mayhew, a hydrogeologist, to survey the wells, which Root said are simply not producing.

He said the surrounding farm land at the water plant were tiled last fall, and perhaps this could be the cause of the wells not producing as in the past.

Root and the mayor met with Paul Capelle, Willard's city manager, and they said that most likely some agreement can be worked out with Willard in the future, which is what the EPA suggested several years ago, that Plymouth get water from the Willard treatment plant.

Capelle told them in an emergency water could be furnished by tankers.

The North street bridge is to be repaired for a sum of \$5,000 from the permissive tax money that the village has on deposit in Huron county. The solicitor, Richard Wolfe, was asked to prepare a resolution to be forwarded to the county commissioners and engineer.

It was also agreed that Dix street be designated one way west from Sandusky street to the alley.

At the request of school authorities, the roadway into Mary Fark park is to be closed during the lunch hour to prevent unnecessary driving which has disrupted the school's routine.

Banner's banner flagging

A 73 per cent decrease in net income in the third quarter that ended Mar. 31 has been reported by Banner Industries, Inc., parent firm of Plymouth Locomotive Works, Inc.

A great decline in motor freight tonnage is said to have been the cause of this.

Although revenues for the first nine months of the fiscal year increased by 12 per cent, the company's profit was less than half that of a year ago.

Banner's two other principal groups, one supplying aircraft replacement parts and the other fabricating industrial products, including locomotives and lift trucks, showed increased earnings of 43 per cent.

Earnings per share for the quarter were nine cents, compared to 31 cents a year ago.

This derived from revenues of \$53,158,016, up about \$4 million from 1979.

For the nine month period, revenues were \$153,432,565, compared to \$137,047,559 in 1979. But net income was down to \$1,755,568, which compares with \$3,937,911 a year ago. Earnings per share were thus 44 cents, compared to 98 cents in 1979.

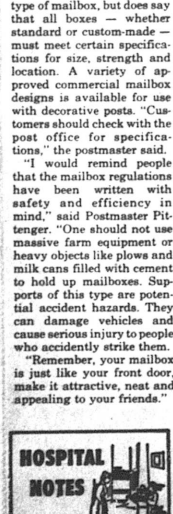

USPM urges box repair on rural route AP chooses PHS grad for top post

"It's time to do something for your winter-weary friend, the mailbox," says Postmaster Ruth Pittenger, "and the perfect time to do it is during Mailbox Improvement week, May 19-24." Residents are urged to examine their mailboxes to determine whether they have been damaged during the winter by weather or vandalism — particularly those located along rural routes. "Some boxes may only need painting," says Postmaster Pittenger. "Others may need to be replaced. Mailbox Improvement week is a good time to decide the best way to improve your mailbox. A damaged or improperly placed box will make it difficult for rural carriers to leave that special letter or package." The Postal Service does not restrict customers to a specific type of mailbox, but does say that all boxes — whether standard or custom-made — must meet certain specifications for size, strength and location. A variety of approved commercial mailbox designs is available for use with decorative posts. "Customers should check with the post office for specifications," the postmaster said. "I would remind people that the mailbox regulations have been written with safety and efficiency in mind," said Postmaster Pittenger. "One should not use massive farm equipment or heavy objects like plows and milk cans filled with cement to hold up mailboxes. Supports of this type are potential accident hazards. They can damage vehicles and cause serious injury to people who accidentally strike them. "Remember, your mailbox is just like your front door, make it attractive, neat and appealing to your friends."
