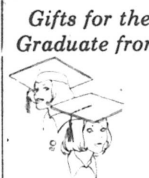

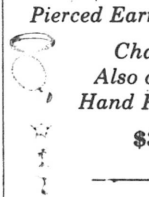

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Pioneer JVS will seek 1-mill levy in November

The Pioneer Joint Vocational School Board of Education approved a request for a 1-mill, one-year levy to be placed on the November ballot.

The request for the levy, which would generate \$1 million, was approved at a meeting Monday night. The money would be split 50-50 or 60-40 between permanent improvements and operations, said Assistant Superintendent Marvin Webb.

Permanent improvement monies would be used to make the building more energy efficient, Webb said. Other projects under consideration include a new roof, a

new student parking lot and replacement of equipment.

Some of the repairs needed are reaching the emergency stage, Webb said. He said, "It's not an emergency levy, but it is an emergency levy."

Operating funds are needed because of the state cuts. A one-mill levy was passed Mar. 4, 1980, after a 92 mill was defeated twice in 1979 by voters in the eight-county school system. The delay in passing that levy is also costing the district money.

"When the levy passed two years ago, we didn't get the money the year we passed it," Webb said. The district was forced to borrow \$450,000 to operate that year.

Absentee ballots are now available at the Huron county board of elections, 180 Millie Avenue, Norwalk, for the June 8, 1982, primary election. Any registered voter in the county is entitled to vote by absentee ballot for any of the following reasons:

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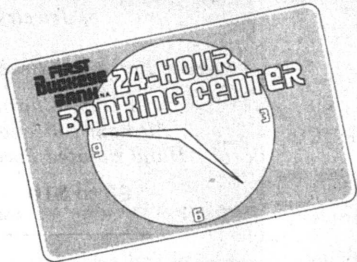
