State-ranked Wildcats captured DIII district meet

GALION — New London, Edison and Plymouth highlighted the boys' district meet at Ammans Reservoir Saturday.

The three teams, along with four individuals, qualified to Saturday's regional meet at Tiffin.

The Wildcats, Chargers, Big Red, Western Reserve, Norwalk and Willard all competed at the Galion site. New London, Plymouth and Western were in Division III competition, while Edison, Norwalk and Willard participated in Division II.

Meanwhile, Monroeville and St. Paul were at the Division III Terra Community College in Fremont site.

The top four teams and 16 individuals all qualified to the regional meet, which is

The Wildcats, who are ranked ninth in the state in Division III, finished first with 47 points. It was the third district title out of the last four years for New London.

Colonel Crawford took second at 70 points, followed by Plymouth, 89 and Crestview, 95. Western finished eighth with 179 points.

In Division II, Edison claimed third with 107 points. Perkins captured the title with 80 points, followed by

Shelby at 100. Ontario notched the fourth spot with 111 points.

Willard finished eighth with 200 points, while Norwalk checked in 10th at 214.

Willard's Ricky Featheringill and Norwalk's Scott Hamernik, and Monroeville's Kyle Schaffer and Brian Koch placed in the top-16 to move on.

New London was led by Thomas Landis, who claimed third in 16:50. He was followed by Russ Roberts, sixth, 17:17; Zac Sendelbach, 10th, 17:36; David Kamm, 13th, 17:50; Jordan Campbell, 15th, 17:54; Ben Kaufman, 22nd, 18:23 and Jeremy Amburgy, 27th, 18:34.

Landis cut 13 seconds off his previous best.

"They've worked very hard," coach Dan Olien said. "They're a close-knit group. It's all about team."

The Wildcats also picked up their fifth big-meet win of the season and improved the overall mark to 87-5.

Jeremy Rowe paced Plymouth, finishing seventh in 17:26. Adam Wade picked up 17th in 18:00; Mike Pritchard, 18th, 18:08; Mike Ball, 21st, 18:18 and Skylar

Branstool, 26th, 18:29.

Edison placed three runners in the top-20. Aaron Jones led the way, at 10th, in 17:06. Pete Hill attained 17th in 17:25; Brian Collins, 19th, 17:27; Matt Triana, 30th, 17:56; Jeff Meinert, 31st, 17:56; A.J. Hart, 48th, 18:41 and Jonathon Sutter, 18:42.

"We're real excited," coach Dean Stanfield said. "It was the first time our top-five all finished in the 17s. Their work ethic is the reason for a lot of this."

Meanwhile, Featheringill took 13th in 17:14; Hamernik, 14th, 17:16; Schaffer, ninth, 17:41 and Koch, 16th, 18:00.
