

McLaughlin makes most of her new chance at JCU

UNIVERSITY HEIGHTS — Mary McLaughlin has seized the opportunity with a new position in the 2004 season.

As John Carroll's lone senior and three-year letter-winner, the St. Paul graduate has played middle back for many years.

Moving to left back, McLaughlin has registered 229 digs through 61 games for an average of 3.75. The average is good for third on the team.

She has over 700 in her career.

In 2002, she recorded season and career highs in digs in the final playoff match of the season against Ohio Athletic Conference foe Capital.

For the season, Leach leads the offense with 295 kills for an average of five per game and tops the team with 34 blocks. In addition, Leach paces B-W in hitting at .381 and has 90 digs, 23 service aces and five assists.
