# Blue Streaks, Steelers Play To 20-20 Tie

Gloom Thick After Witkowski Picks Up Fumble, Runs For Point

Sandusky's Blue Streaks remained on the unbeaten list with a 20-20 deadlock with Lorain's Steelers last night, but you could have cut the gloom in the Streaks' dressing room with a carving knife after the contest.

Statistics showed the Steelers deserved at least a tie, but to the Streaks, who had victory in their grasp until the final three minutes, the deadlock was as heartbreaking as a loss.


