## Streaks' Defense Again Superlative

Exploding their offensive fireworks in short bursts, Sandusky High's Blue Streaks rolled over Elyria Pioneers 20-6 last night before a crowd of 4,000 at Ely stadium. It was the second straight victory for the Streaks this season, the second in a row over Elyria in two years and evened the 40 game series at 19 victories for each team.

The Sanduskians came from behind to score 13 points in a two minute splurge just before the first half ended and produced the final seven points in the fourth quarter, covering 52 yards in seven plays.

Sophomore Jude Theibert scored the initial Sandusky touchdown carried over to the fourth and on a three yard sweep. Darrell Hurlburt raced 15 yards for the second TD and Sophomore Chuck Acierto dashed around end for one vard and the third touchdown.




