# Streaks Rout A's With Second Half Blast

# 39-6 Romp Highest Total first downs ..... 12 First downs rushing .... 8 Total Since 1944

Nothing worked the first half, everything clicked in the second—that's the story behind Sandusky High's Blue Streaks 39-6 rout of Ashland last night before 6,000 fans at Strobel field.

The victory was Sandusky's third in a row and the loss was the first for Ashland. It was the highest number of points amassed by a Blue Streak aggregation since 1944 when Sandusky topped Sylvania 60-0.

Checked 0-0 at halftime, six Sandusky players shared touchdown glory as the Streaks exploded for 13 points in the third period and 26 in the final stanza. The lone Ashland TD came on a last quarter desperation pass.

After the game, Sandusky Coach Jeff DeHaven gave a plausible reason for Sandusky's inability to move the first half. Ashland was using a 5-4-2 defense with the four linebackers playing so close it was practically a


