Score On Pass From Middaugh To Jim Ross

The Truckers ended up in a 7-7 tie last night as they played in the rubber game in a football preview at Fostoria.

The preview saw Van Buren beat Rising Sun 6 to 0 in the first game, and Bucyrus walloped St. Wendelins 21-0 in the second. Norwalk played Fostoria in the finale. All three games consisted of two short halves.

Faster Club
The Fostoria club equalled the Truckers in size and had the edge on the local eleven in speed. Led by a very swift halfback Fostoria scored early in the first half.

The Truckers came right back and were well on their way to paydirt when the period ended. Ernie Kohlmyer carried the ball well in this series. Blocking was very sharp.

The second half saw the local eleven pick right up where they left off. Quarterback Bud Middaugh, mixing his plays very well tossed the touchdown pass to Jim Ross in the end zone.

Three Passes
Statisticians, Norwalk completed three out of four passes for 30 yards, while Fostoria did not toss one a yard.

On the ground, the Truckers gained 87 yards from scrimmage to 97 for the Fostoria club. Each team made five first downs.

There were no punts. Norwalk was penalized 15 yards while Fostoria received five.

Umpire Nallin To Be Buried In Maryland
FREDERICK, Md. (UP)—Richard F. Nallin, a major league umpire for 29 years who died Friday at the age of 78, will be buried here on Monday.

Nallin, who introduced the multiple umpire system in the American League, worked in the scandal-ridden 1919 World Series between the Chicago White Sox and Cincinnati Redlegs and often recalled that the games never arouse his suspicion.

Early Wynn Gets Nod After Tribe Drops 2-1 Decision To Chicago's Jack Harshman

CLEVELAND, O. (UP)—The Cleveland Indians battled today to keep the surging Chicago White Sox from pulling even with them in second place in the American League.

The White Sox, now just one game behind the Tribe, served notice that they aim to push the Indians out of second place when they took the first of a four-game series, 2-1, Friday night.

Early Wynn will try for his 17th victory against eight defeats today against Bill Pierce with an 18-7 record for Chicago.

Friday night's defeat was a setback for veteran Indian pitcher Bob Lemon. It foiled another try for the 29th victory of his career.

Jack Harshman took the decision as he held the Indians to four hits. Four of his 13 victories have been scored over Cleveland.

Lemon pitched all the way in a vain effort for his 29th, but a fluke triple by Nellie Fox in the seventh inning drove in Luis Aparicio with the winning run. Lemon suffered his 12th loss against 18 wins.

Opens With A Walk
Aparicio walked to open the inning and Fox sliced a hit to left with two out, bouncing past Al Smith.

The Indians went into the lead in the first inning when Smith walked, moved to second on a sacrifice, and scored on Al Rosen's double to right. Harshman didn't give them many chances after that, not a man getting beyond first base the rest of the game. He fanned eight batters.

The White Sox tied the score and Minnie Minoso broke an American League record in the sixth. Larry Doby singled with one out, and Minoso was hit by a pitch for his 22nd time, breaking the old record held by Jake Stahl and Buck Harris. Doby scored on Sherman Lollar's single to deaden the game.

NEW YORK (UP)—Perhaps a look at his favorite "cousin" pitcher, Camilo Pascual of the Washington Senators, will snap Mickey Mantle out of his home run slump today.

Mantle, hasn't hit a homer since Aug. 31 and now, with 47 homers in 135 games, the Yankee slugger stands two home runs behind the pace set by Babe Ruth when he posted the all-time record of 60 for a season in 1927.

In fact, Mantle hasn't hit a homer since the last time he faced Pascual. He's hit five off the Senators' righthander this year, more than he's hit off any other pitcher.

Wildcats Win Two At Huron Grid Preview

NEW LONDON — The Wildcats won two, and looked very impressive, last night at a football preview of the Lakeland Conference at Huron.

The four teams, each playing two quarters, were New London, Huron, Vermilion, and Margaretta. Huron played Vermilion, a scoreless tie, and defeated Margaretta in the second quarter, 6 to 0.

New London won both of their games, beating Vermilion 6 to 0 in the first, and Margaretta 7 to 0 in the finale.

The first Wildcat score was set up by halfback Bobby Randleman who sprinted 40 yards to the Vermilion 4-yard marker. Ricky Nestor went over from that point. The conversion was missed.

Gordon Staschke blocked a Margaretta punt on the 25-yard line to set up the touchdown in the second game. On the next play he took the pigskin for ten yards, then Randleman went up the center for six points. Nestor kicked the extra point.

Royals Defeat Toronto In Doubleheader

The Rochester Royals, with the realization that just one more loss will eliminate them from the International League pennant race, held on grimly Friday night to defeat league-leading Toronto in both ends of a twin-bill.

The two teams will meet each other in their last two games of the season today and Sunday. If Rochester wins both, it will finish .001 percentage points ahead of the Leafs. Toronto needs to win just once to claim the flag.

A three-run 10th inning homer by Allie Clark gave the Royals a 5-2 victory in the second game after they had won the opener, 5-4. Mel Wright and Ellis Cofe Deal both picked up victories in relief.

In other action, Miami ended a run famine by whipping Havana, 7-4, to move into third place, half a game ahead of Montreal. The Royals lost to Buffalo, 10-6, and the Richmond Virginians protected their hold on fifth place with a 5-2 decision over Columbus.

Detroit's Lions Thump Cleveland 17-0; Bobby Layne Leads Attack

If pre-season exhibitions mean anything, the Cleveland Browns and the Detroit Lions, the top and bottom teams in the National Football League last season, will change places this year.

The Lions, who had perhaps the NFL's worst offense and definitely the most porous defense in 1955, are about to make a complete reverse and they have a "healthy" Bobby Layne ready to open the season in a couple of weeks.

Layne, out most of last season with a tricky shoulder, led the Lions to their second straight exhibition victory Friday night and their third in four starts — 17-0 over the Browns, who have beaten only the College All-Stars in five games thus far.

Three games are on tap tonight. The Chicago Bears (3-0) meet the Pittsburgh Steelers (1-1) at Pittsburgh; the Green Bay Packers (3-0) tackle the Washington Redskins (1-2) at Winston Salem, N.C., and the New York Giants (2-1) play the San Francisco Forty Niners (3-0) at Portland, Ore. In Sunday's lone contest, the Baltimore Colts (2-1) and Philadelphia Eagles (0-4) meet in Louisville.

Carter Gets Lopsided Win Over Summerlin

NEW YORK (UP)—Young Harold Carter's threat as a heavyweight contender seemed more dangerous today because of the lopsided, turn-table beating he gave tall Johnny Summerlin in their return television bout Friday night.

Managing Director Harry Markson of the International Boxing Club said, "Carter's first main-event performance at Madison Square Garden established him as a threat. We'll match him with another contender as soon as possible — certainly within two months."

Carter, the 22-year old Sunday school teacher from Linden, N.J., who is ranked eighth among contenders, gave ninth-rated Johnny of Detroit such a one-sided beating that he won the unanimous decision by a 9-1, 9-1, 6-3 vote in rounds.

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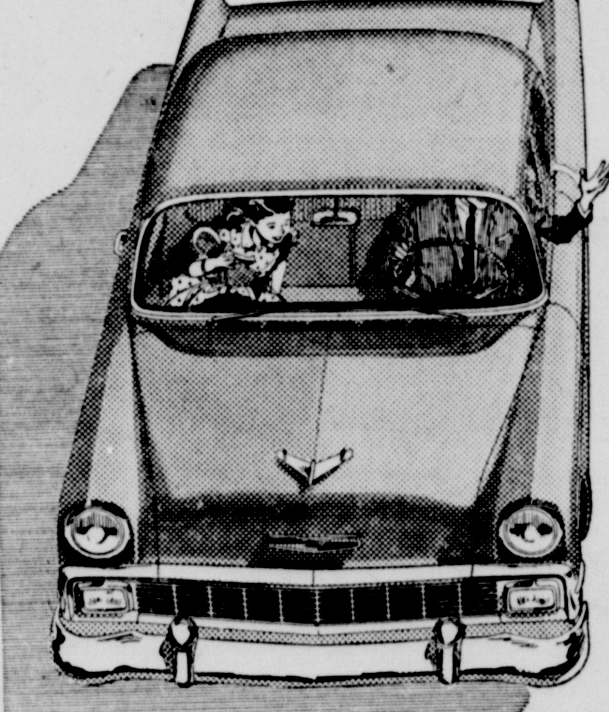
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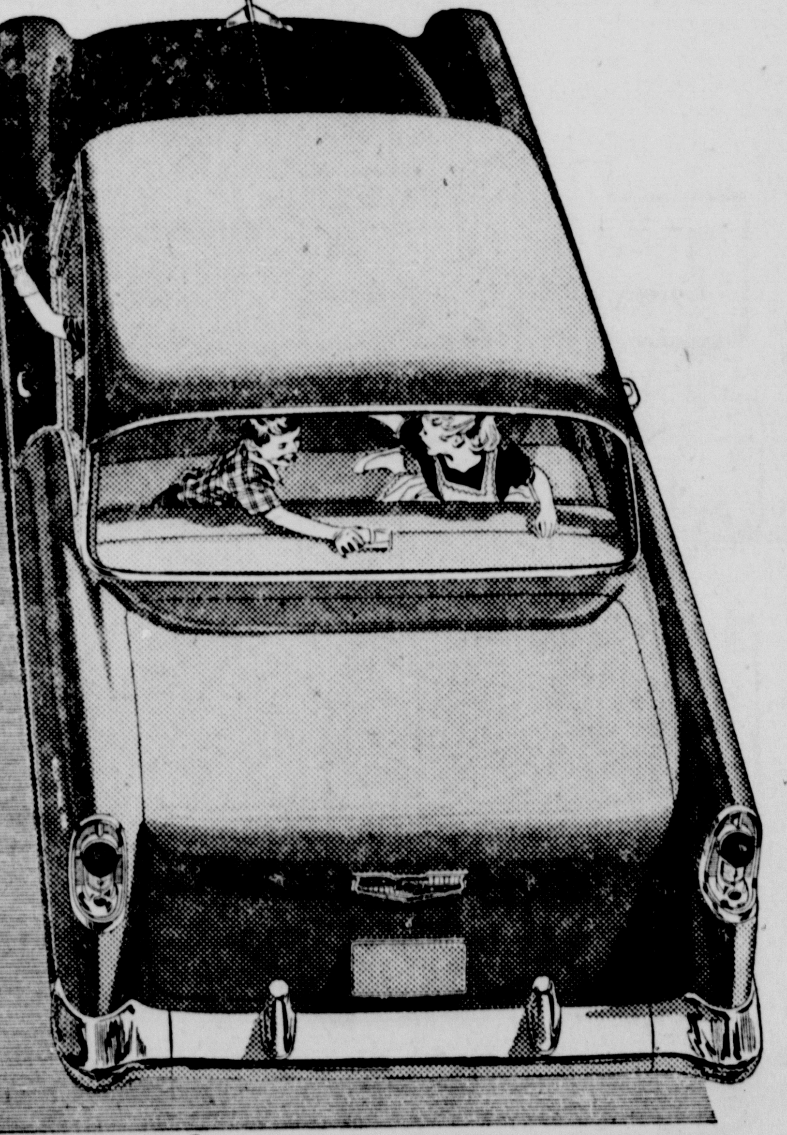
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
