Third Shutout For Redmen

Norwalk, Bellevue, Willard Win NOL Openers; Shelby Gets Score

Defending champion Shelby, Bellevue and Norwalk were expected to wage a battle for the 1960 Northern Ohio League football championship and all three posted wins in their initial loop tests Friday night.

While Bellevue polished off Tiffin Columbian, 34-0, and Norwalk belted Bucyrus, 38-20, Shelby was given a stiff test by Galion before pulling out a 16-8 victory.

In the other opening-night encounter, Willard handed Upper Sandusky its third consecutive loss by a 28-0 count.

"Doormat" snarls Shelby was rated as the team to beat in the eight-school loop based on the fact they rolled over

everyone in the NOL last year and opened the season with a 50-8 triumph over Ashland. Galion was considered as a "doormat", having dropped its first two outings.

But it was nothing of the sort for the Whippets who were backed against the wall in the waning minute of play. Galion drove 61 yards late in the game to Shelby's 14, but two passes were batted away from the receivers in the end zone.

Wilber, Lemon Star

Port Clinton Snares Key NLL Win Over Perrysburg

PORT CLINTON—John Wilber came back to haunt Perrysburg in a Northern Lakes League thriller here Friday night as Port Clinton came up with a 28-18 victory, but the veteran halfback received some solid support from running mate Jerry Lemon.

Wilber, 170-pound senior, paced the Redskins to a 28-18 win over Perrysburg last season, scoring three touchdowns. He carried the ball only 12 times this time out against the Yellowjackets, but gained 174 yards for an average of 14.5 per try.

Lemon was also a standout for the Redskins as they notched their third straight victory. The 165-pound senior was given the assignment 22 times and managed 113 yards to give the half-

back returned a punt 17 yards. Perrysburg tied it up in the second quarter when Tony Snyder went in from the one as the visitors marched 88 yards in 11 plays.

Wilber responded midway through the period with a 10-yard sweep on ensuing kickoff which he returned 40 yards to midfield. Lemon added the extra points. Again Perrysburg came back with Snyder hitting in from inches out.

Wilber received the kickoff and returned to Port Clinton's 40 and on the very next play raced 60 yards around right end after a large hole was opened. Perrysburg fought back once again with fullback Jerry Hoffman going in from three yards out to clinch a 90-yard march and it was 20-18 with Port Clinton holding the upper hand.

Lemon added an insurance marker in the fourth stanza with a three yard plunge up the middle. Tom Mackay set this touchdown up with a pass interception on his own five and the Redskins marched right down to score with four seconds left in the canto and Lemon also added the PAT.

Joe Lukac singled out linemen John Smith, Bob Jones, Dick Below, Jim Gensman and Eddy Martin for outstanding efforts as Port Clinton once again fought off a game Perrysburg 11.

In another NLL outing, Maumee, co-champion with Port Clinton in 1959, smashed Rossford, 35-8, as Chuck Wegner passed for two touchdowns and scored another. Anthony Wayne scored twice in the opening stanza and held on to down Eastwood, 12-6, in the other loop encounter.

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Perkins achieved its second victory under Ted Schwanger and matched its win output of the past two grid seasons in doing so Friday afternoon with an 18-12 conquest of Western Reserve.

The Pirates hung up their second triumph after an 8-0 loss to Norwalk St. Paul and made Schwanger's debut on the S. Campbell St. turf a successful one although they lacked the lustre of a week ago.

Far from the club that steamrolled over Mohawk, 32-0, last week, Perkins still had enough to defeat Western Reserve with hard-hitting halfback Bud Wertz scoring all three touchdowns.

Wertz, 140-pound senior, tallied on runs of five, nine and three yards in enjoying his finest "hour" of football since arriving at Perkins before last season from Crestline.

Wertz outgained Western's powerful fullback Larry Nosack, the Pirate back ripping off yardage totalling 144 in 18 carries, while Nosack managed 115 for

the afternoon in 22 attempts.

The Pirates relaxed several times on both offense and defense which cost them a touchdown in the final minute of play, but hit hard when they decided to play ball. Jim Hunter and Dan Faulkner came through with fine efforts from their linebacker slots.

Slow Start Again

For the third consecutive game, Perkins got off to a slow start with neither club hitting the score-

board in the initial quarter. However, the Pirates broke through in the second period to hold a 6-0 halftime lead and made it 12-0 before the Roughriders counted late in the third stanza to make it 12-6 going into the final 12-minute segment.

Wertz picked up his third six-pointer on the fifth play of the quarter and Western hit paydirt for the second time with 32 seconds remaining.

Nosack ran 18 yards on the first

play from scrimmage in the game, but Perkins held and gained possession following a punt. However, when Stan Crist attempted to punt, he couldn't get it away and Western was on the hosts 38. Four plays netted just five yards and Perkins moved to Western's 25 before losing the ball on downs.

Intercepted Pass

An intercepted pass set up the first score with Jim Pruitt coming up with the theft on Perkins' 34 and returning 13 to the 47. The Pirates drove 53 yards in 10 plays with Wertz hitting off right tackle for the touchdown from five yards out. Tom Smith carried four times for 25 yards in the march. Crist attempted to add the extra points on a run, but failed.

It took the Pirates only five plays to go 51 yards after guard Mike Shelby returned the second half kickoff four yards after taking the short kick. Wertz picked up three and Crist swept right end for 18 and a first down on the 30. Wertz got seven off right tackle and Smith bulldied his way for 14 more over the left side and it was first and goal on the nine.

Wertz then cracked off right tackle once again and shook off a pair of tacklers to race into the end zone. The PAT again failed and it was 12-0 with 10:10 left in the third period.

Western Rebounds

Western Reserve struck back by driving 70 yards with the ensuing kickoff in 18 plays with a roughing the kicker and interference penalties aiding the cause considerably.

Seemingly halted on their own 34, the Roughriders punted, but a roughing the kicker penalty gave them a first down. Again they seemingly lost possession after reaching the 30 as Ron Nichols' fourth-down pass fell incomplete. However, an interference penalty was called and the Roughriders were on the Pirate 21.

They moved to the seven and a fourth down situation with the same number of yards to go for the touchdown and Nichols found halfback John Cassidy all alone in the end zone and it was a quick six-point play. Nosack's bid for the two-point conversion with 2:30 remaining in the quarter failed.

Come Right Back

Perkins came right back to score again on a 58-yard march in 11 plays with Wertz smacking off tackle from three yards out with 10:35 yet to go.

The Pirates fumbled during the drive, but center Danny Faulkner recovered for a three-yard advance and Wertz set up the score with a 15-yard run around left end on a pitchout with Smith throwing a key block to shake the senior loose.

After blocking a Western punt attempt midway through the stanza, the Pirates relaxed just a

The Pirates will have to return to form against Lakeside here Friday if they are to make it three straight. Perkins had only a 1-7-1 mark in 1958 and 1-8 last year and with its two wins, already has equalled that mark. Schwanger wants more and he will get them if his club gets underway quicker than they have thus far.
