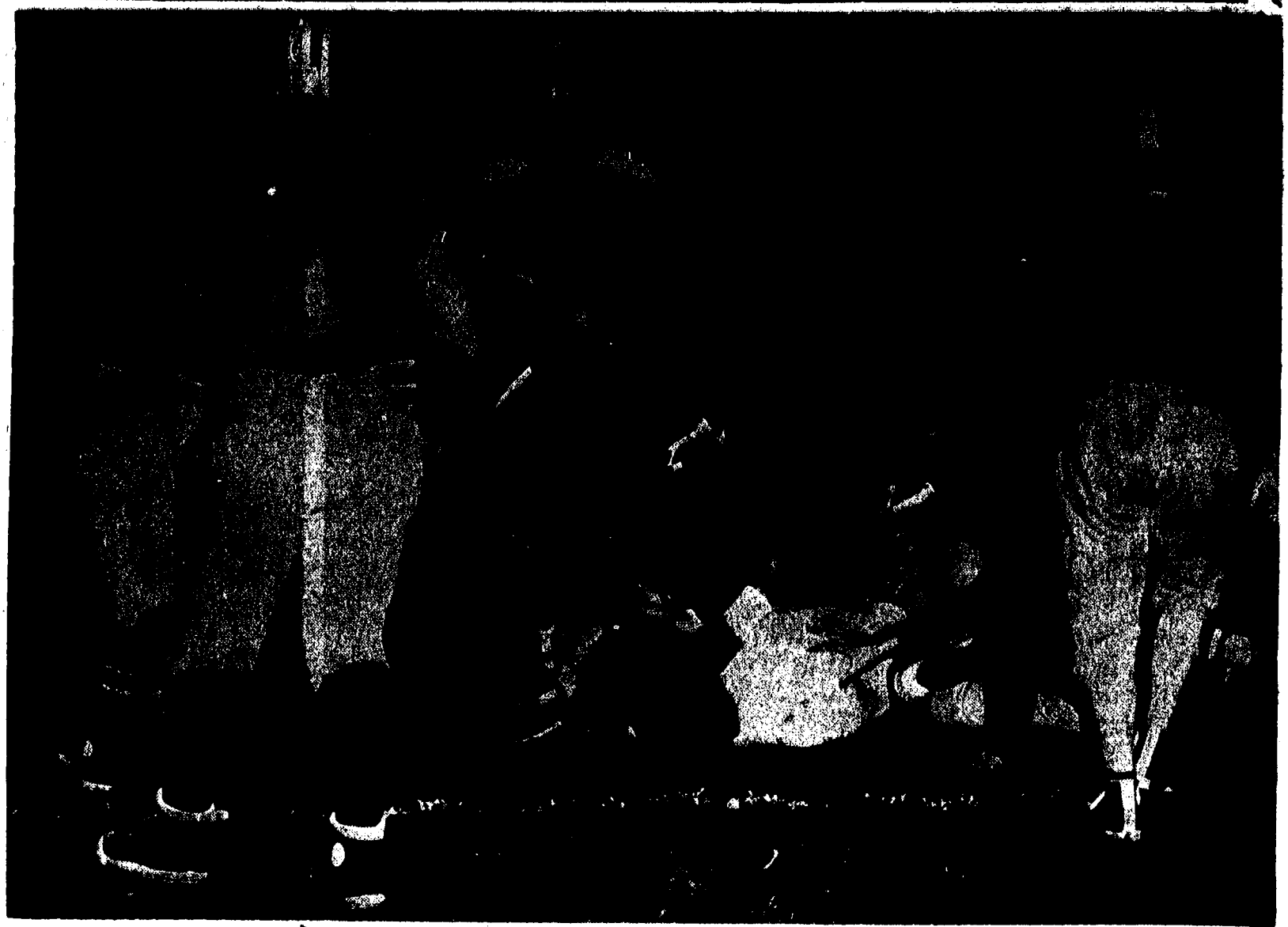




Two blockers clear a path for Southwest back

St. Mary, Perkins In Season Finales

The Buckeye Conference and Seaway Conference are the only two leagues who won't have their champion — or champions — decided by this weekend.

One title has already been tucked away, Fremont St. Joe taking top honors in the Sandusky Bay Conference, with the decisions on the books in the Lakeland Conference, Northern Ohio League, Northern Lakes League and North Central Conference.

Sandusky High will bid to maintain its spotless record at Findlay Friday night in a Buckeye encounter, while Sandusky St. Mary and Perkins will be closing out their seasons at the same time.

St. Mary, without a win in seven starts, will put its toes away after invading Clyde for an SBC match, while Perkins (4-3) will be shooting for its first winning season against Lakota at Rising sun.

Earle Bruce's SHS club, upset ripe, will be heavily favored against the Trojans, as will be BC co-leader Marion Harding in its game at Fremont Ross — victories that would set the stage for their climatic season-ending battle at Marion, Nov. 11.

Elyria and Lorain take a night off from Buckeye warfare Friday, the Pioneers hosting Toledo Macomber and the Steelers welcoming unbeaten Cleveland St. Joseph.

Match Perfect Marks
Top independent match of the 32-game weekend schedule comes off Saturday night at Harmon Field in Fremont when St. Joe and Gibsonburg match 8-0 records.

The Northern Ohio League boasts the only head-on meeting for top honors, Norwalk and Shelby mixing it at W. W. Skiles Field in Shelby.

Both are unbeaten on the season, the Truckers in eight games and the Whippets in seven.

Other final night, NOL action will see Bellevue heavily favored to lock up third place at Willard, Bucyrus plays at Tiffin Columbian and Galion at Upper Sandusky.

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Southwest Rules Grade Grid Loop

Southwest carted off the Grade School Football League crown Tuesday night at Strobel Field with a 16-14 decision over Southeast scheduled as part of the annual preview unveiling the sixth grade gridders.

The ruling champions are composed of boys from Barker and Mills schools, while the runnersup consist of sixth-graders from Hancock and Campbell.

The victory gave Southwest a 3-0 record on the season, while Southeast wound up with a 2-1 mark. Northeast captured one victory in three outings and Northwest failed to record a triumph in the four regular season games.

Arny Keys and Lynn Cook scored touchdowns for the champions with Keys adding both extra points to account for the difference as Tom Pope and Vic Malinovsky collared six-pointers for Southeast, but counted only one PAT. Both clubs had goal-line stands in the see-saw battle.

Blank Foes
In the other outing, Northeast posted a 12-0 victory over the Northwest in two six-minute quarters compared to the four six-minute segments for the championship tilt.

Northeast players came from Ontario and Sycamore schools with Madison, Monroe and Osborne boys making up the Northwest squad.

Glen Rehufus was supervisor of the entire program with Chuck Snowden, Don Redman and Lowell Everingham forming the coaching staff for the grade school kings with Edgar Newton, Tony Andres, Carl Lehrer and George Mylander the backbone of the runnersup.

Green Bay's Taylor Challenging Brown; Plum Tops Passers

NEW YORK (UPI) — Fullback Jimmy Brown of the Cleveland Browns is getting a stiff challenge for the National Football League ground-gaining championship by Jim Taylor of the Green Bay Packers.

Brown, who led the league in rushing for the past three seasons, retained first place this week with a total of 492 yards gained in 84 carries, according to official NFL statistics released today.

Taylor, a third-year pro who once played at LSU, has moved to within 8 yards of Brown. The Green Bay Packers' work-horse has carried a league high of 108 times and gained 484 yards.

Brown's average of 5.9 yards per carry was tops in the league, while Dan Lewis of the Detroit Lions had the longest run from scrimmage, a 74-yarder against the Los Angeles Rams last Sunday.

Quarterback Milt Plum again topped the passers, giving the

Browns the league leaders in the air as well as on the ground. In 74 throws, Plum has completed 55 passes for a remarkable 74.3 percentage. He has not yet been intercepted and his average gain of 13.2 yards per pass also is high. The passing standings are based on a compilation of six factors.

Johnny Unitas of the Baltimore Colts jumped into second place ahead of Norm Van Brocklin of the Philadelphia Eagles, who was idle last week. Unitas was tops in touchdown passes with 13 and in total yardage gained with 1,454.

Ray Berry of the Colts was tops in pass receptions with 36 for a total of 725 yards and six touchdowns; Van Brocklin remained first in punting with a 46.4-yard average, and Paul Hornung of the Packers led in scoring with a total of 65 points resulting from 5 touchdowns, 17 conversions and 6 field goals.
