Aaron, 2 More Heavily Fined For 'Runouts'

NEW YORK (UPI)—The office of Baseball Commissioner Ford Frick disclosed yesterday that Hank Aaron of the Milwaukee Braves has been fined \$1,000 and Charley Neal and Maury Wills of the Los Angeles Dodgers \$500 each for failing to go through with a barnstorming game in Durham, N.C., Oct. 14.

Three other players who failed to appear for the game escaped fines. Outfielder Lee Maye of Milwaukee was given the choice of joining the tour or paying a fine and joined; outfielder Wes Covington of Milwaukee and first baseman Bill White of St. Louis had \$500 fines rescinded because they offered "legitimate excuses."

A spokesman for Frick said the fines were levied 10 days ago. No announcement had been made until now.

The six players had been scheduled to appear in Durham in a game between Negro major leaguers, divided into the "American League All-Stars" and "National League All-Stars."

Frick's spokesman said a complaint was filed with the commissioner in the case by Eddie Glennon, promoter of the game in Durham.

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Roughriders Dish Out 28-8 Loss To Plymouth

WAKEMAN—Western Reserve clinched part of the North Central Conference championship here Saturday afternoon with a surprisingly easy 28-8 triumph over Plymouth.

The Roughriders and Berlin Heights deadlocked for the crown with three wins and a tie in four outings as the NCC went out of existence with this weekend's action.

Western Reserve moved into the lead after taking the opening kickoff with Boyd Martin picking up the six points on a sweep around end of 10 yards. Fullback Larry Nosack cracked up the middle to annex the extra points.

Plymouth Ties Score

Plymouth knotted the count later in the first period with Dayton Red's passing accounting for the eight-point score. The senior quarterback hit Jim Russell on an 18-yarder for the score and then connected with Ken Jamlee to ring up the PAT.

The Roughriders recorded a pair of touchdowns in the second quarter to enjoy a 20-8 halftime edge and then added icing on the cake in the final stanza with an insurance marker.

Dave Nichols uncorked a long aerial to Martin covering 44 yards and Western Reserve was out front to stay as Dale Patrick came back later in the quarter to go five yards.

Nosack, Western's power run-

ner inside the ends all season long, wound up the scoring with a 6-yard run in the fourth canto and Patrick followed with the bonus points to give the Roughriders a share of the title.

Western's victory gave Tony Aeillo's club a 5-2-1 record on the season. Plymouth is now even in eight starts.
