The crack Mansfield Senior High defensive unit has not permitted a touchdown in the last nine quarters.

In fact the opposition has scored only twice, averaging 2.8 points per game. Lorain last night showed occasional offensive spurts but managed only 122 yards, 59 on passes.

Lorain carried 33 times for 66 yards, six times being tossed for losses by the alert Bengals.

Mansfield rolled up 367 yards, gaining 301 of them on 49 rushing plays. Henry Weaver was the big gainer with 122 yards on 15 carries and Mitchell, starting for the second time picked up 64 on seven. He gained 54 on his first three jaunts.

Chick Breeden and Jim Knudson topped Lorain with 22 apiece. Lorain gained only 16 yards rushing in the second half.

End Elroy Allen has now caught nine 1961 passes and scored touchdowns on six of them. Weaver leads the Tygers with eight TD's.

Spotter Bob Boyd and Statistician Dick Schwab won the press box score guessing. Boyd tabbed the outcome 34-0 and Schwab 40-0. Each missed by three points.

The Mansfield Senior High marching band's show at halftime had the theme of "Tunes of America."

The band formed the numerals "76" with a presentation of a file and drum corps playing the popular tune of the revolutionary era, "The Girl I Left Behind."

In honor of all who died in the service of the country the band formed two crosses while playing the "Battle Hymn of the Republic."

The show concluded with the immortal "Stars and Stripes Forever" with the piccolo obligato played by DiAnne Snyder and Kathi Michener.

The Lorain band played to a western theme at halftime, with the Majorettes garbed in cowboy hats, vests and bandanas.

After Mansfield had taken the lead 24-0 Lorain's Chick Breeden took the kickoff and fumbled on the return. The ball flew into the air and on the scramble for possession referee George Ellis of Akron was caught between the players and ended up sprawled out on the field.

Eleven Mansfield sophomores flooded the field for the last two plays of the game.

Coach Bill Doolittle used his first offensive unit most of the way but gave all 40 varsity players some service.

George Sherman, the retiring Tyger ticket manager, was honored at a pep assembly yesterday at Senior High.

The veteran official received the football which was used in the Tygers' victory over Cincinnati Taft — and it was autographed by all the players.

Jim Schroeder, who started the first three games at quarterback, did not see action last night. The injury he sustained in the Newark game last week saw to that.

Yankees Under Pressure In Cincy

Yanks Fret Over Reds' Home Park

CINCINNATI, Ohio (AP)—The World Series plunged into its third game today with the New York Yankees fretting over the landscaping of compact Crosley Field and the steamed - up Cincinnati Reds scenting a second successive series victory.

Despite their 2-1 betting edge, the pressure definitely was on the aching Yankees as the series, after a one-day layoff, resumed in perfect weather before an overflow crowd of 32,000 mainly wild-eyed Redleg partisans.

Compared with New York where neither of the first two games drew capacity, the series fever is burning at terrific pitch in this Ohio River metropolis.

Both clubs were down to their No. 3 first-line pitchers — Cincinnati's Bob Purkey, 32, a knuckleballer, facing New York's Bill Stafford, who just completed his first full major-league season. Purkey had a 16-12 regular season mark, and Stafford, also a right-hander, had 14-9.

In Friday's workout in freshly, all - white painted Crosley Park, the Yankees were obviously concerned over the lush infield grass and the sharply - terraced outfield perimeter which, it is said, is mounded over utility pipes.

NO HELP
It was reported the quite high infield grass, which would slow down rollers considerably, would be trimmed before game time. Consensus is that the Yankees have a better defensive infield than the Reds and would profit less from any grassy assistance.

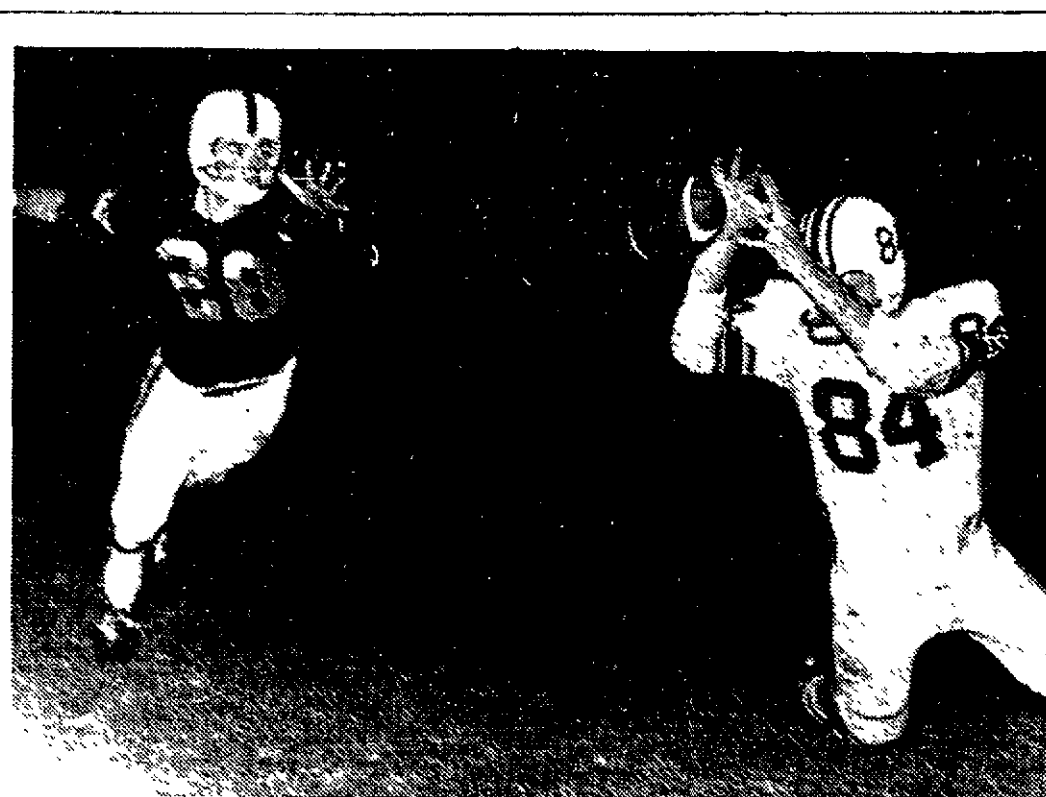
As for the outfield terrace, it begins to rise some 20 feet from the walls and the pitch is especially sharp in left field where Yankee Yogi Berra customarily plays his "side-saddle" defensive game.

This is a game in which the benched Mickey Mantle could turn the tide for the Yankees, who have had absolutely no help from their famed and fabled M&M home-run combination. Roger Maris, who set the all-time season homer mark of 61, as yet to hit the ball out of the infield in this series.

MANTLE ERUPTS
Maris failed to reach the Crosley Field 360-foot right-field bleacher mark in Friday's batting drill. But Mantle, who missed the two New York games because of an infected hip, swung an explosive bat in practice. He boomed four balls into the right-field stands, two into the center-field stands — batting left handed — and lofted two over the left-field wall at the 340-foot mark hitting right-handed.

Yankee Mgr. Ralph Houk said he would not decide on whether Mantle could start until today's pregame batting drill, but added "Although I'm not ready to say he'll play, it looks less doubtful now."

Schafrath Misses Washington Tiff By Marshall's Lone Ney

WASHINGTON (UPI) — It appeared today that Cleveland Browns' Tackle Dick Schafrath would not be eligible to play against George Preston Marshall's Washington Redskins at Cleveland Sunday.

Marshall cast the only negative vote in a National Football League poll on Schafrath's eligibility Friday, and that one "no" vote was enough, under league rules, to prevent the former Ohio Stater from playing with the Browns this season.

Schafrath is a member of the Ohio Air National Guard and was called to active duty a week ago. He was given permission by his military commander to play for the Browns on weekends as long as it did not interfere with his military duties.

The NFL, however, required a unanimous approval of league members for Schafrath to remain on the Browns' roster.

Marshall, the Redskins owner, said he would agree to Schafrath's playing with the Browns as long as the big tackle did not return to action until next Monday. This would mean Schafrath would miss the Browns-Redskins game Sunday.

Marshall once had the same kind of situation when, in 1950, Cleveland Coach Paul Brown voted against the Redskins' using a backfield coach in place of injured quarterback Sammy Baugh.

Marshall, with Baugh injured and spare quarterback Harry Gilmer also suffering from a sore arm, had asked the NFL for permission to activate coach Tommy Mont, but Brown, whose team was to meet the Redskins in the next game, voted against the request.

The Browns won that game.

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Navy Spills Miami; Penn, Florida Win

A shoeless quarterback, a major upset, a disabled referee, and an odd injury served to introduce the season's third big college football weekend last night.

Navy's hard-charging Middles not only ripped Miami's offensive patterns at key moments en route to a 17-6 upset but also piled up a referee's badly he had to leave the game.

Penn State quarterback Pete Liske, who inherited the No. 1 job only this week, ably directed the Nittany Lions to a first-half lead and capped his effort by literally running out of a shoe on a 33-yard touchdown that capped State's 32-0 conquest of hapless Boston University.

Florida used the old sleeper play and a second-string quarterback to engineer a second-half comeback and a 14-3 victory over winless Tulane.

FIRED-UP
Fired-up Navy gave half-back Jim Stewart beautiful downfield blocking as he swept 83 yards on a swing-pass play that accounted for a 7-0 second-quarter lead over two - touchdown favorite Miami.

Navy defenders made the lead stand up, charging so hard they not only rocked the Miami runners but also put Referee John Lynch out of the game after he had got in the way of a Navy back.

Bobby Dodd Jr., son of the Georgia Tech football coach, directed Florida's second-half rally that overcame Tulane's 3-0 lead.

Northridge broke the ice in the second quarter when Doug Dispenette scored the first of his two touchdowns on a one-yard plunge. North led at halftime, 8-0.
