

NOL Title Again Bellevue's

Rip Norwalk 38-0 To Finish Unbeaten

Bellevue chalked up its fourth consecutive Northern Ohio League grid championship and third unbeaten season in the last four years by breezing to a 38-0 triumph over arch-rival Norwalk Friday.

The Redmen concluded their 1964 campaign with a glossy 7-0-2 record and Lowell Shaffer's last four teams have compiled an unbelievable 23-1-3 mark.

Bellevue went undefeated in nine games in both 1961 and 1962 and claimed undisputed loop titles. They were 8-1 a year ago and had to share honors with Bucyrus and Willard. However, they grabbed all the

marbles this fall with a 5-0-2 league record. In other loop finales, Galion handed Tiffin Columbian a 20-0 setback, Bucyrus routed Willard, 18-0, and Shelby upended Upper Sandusky, 26-6.

SENIOR BACKS Dick Seymour, Nick Lilli and Mark Hoffman sparked Bellevue's attack which netted 408 yards in total offense.

Seymour collared three touchdowns and Nick Lilli two, while Hoffman passed for a pair of scores to Seymour. The Redmen drove 55 yards

in six plays the first time they had possession with Seymour galloping 11 yards for the score with 7:01 left in the opening period. They came right back after another Norwalk punt to march 33 yards in 8 plays with Hoffman connecting with Seymour in the flat for 12 yards and the score.

BELLEVUE HIKED its lead to 18-0 by scoring with 1:20 left in the first half, driving 88 yards in 4 plays with Lilli scampering 46 for the score. After a scoreless third stanza,

the Redmen exploded for three touchdowns in the final period. Hoffmann passed for 5 yards to Seymour with 49 seconds gone in the period, Lilli raced 26

yards on the third play after Dave Doster intercepted a Trucker pass and Carl Pambianco slipped in from 2 yards out late in the stanza.

Norwalk's deepest penetration was to Bellevue's 38 as the Truckers went down to their seventh loss against one win and a tie.

GALION GRABBED the runner spot with a 4-1-2 record

as Terry Strickler scored all three touchdowns on runs of three yards twice and four and other time.

The Tigers scored in each of the last three periods to hand Columbian its second loop defeat against four wins and a tie.

BUCYRUS RECORDED all of its points in the second half in handing Willard its sixth loss in nine games.

The Redmen picked up a safety early in the third period when Jim Walker cracked in to drp Rick Hosler for a four-yard

loss in the end zone. Dave Montague connected on a touchdown pass to Gary Kleingenberger in the final period and skirted end for 5 yards in the third period. He also passed twice for the PAT to Ron Howell.

SHELBY SPOTTED Upper Sandusky a 6-0 lead then stormed back to ring up two touchdowns in the second and third quarters.

Larry Baldridge raced 57 and 12 yards for second-period markers to make it 12-6 at intermission and Bill Beshore bulled over from 11 yards out and Bill Foreman plunged a yard in the third canto.

New London, Huron Charge To LC Wins

Tigers Bar Wildcats' Path To Share Of Honors Next Friday

New London must topple Huron in its finale next week to gain a share of the Lakeland Conference crown which Oberlin has already clinched by lambasting Midview, 62-0.

The Wildcats overcame a 14-8 deficit to turn back Amherst, 32-14, for their sixth conference win in seven starts. Oberlin completed its Lakeland schedule with a 7-1 mark.

Huron also came from behind to hand Ridgeville a 26-18 reversal and Clearview stopped Wellington, 12-0, in the other game.

NEW LONDON grabbed a 8-0 lead early in the second period when Steve Cooke barged over from the 4 and Dave Neel passed to Don Perry for the PAT.

However, Amherst battled back to snare a 14-8 halftime lead. Terry Hall plunged 3 and 1 yards to give the hosts the advantage.

New London tied the score when Cooke rambled 55 yards in the third quarter and then sewed up its seventh win in nine starts with an 18-point spree in the fourth canto.

Neel passed to Rick Evans for the go-ahead points with less than two minutes gone in the period and came back later in the quarter to hit Kevin Geiger for a 5-yard scoring pass. Dean Campbell intercepted an Amherst pass and returned 29 yards to paydirt less than one minute later.

Cooke, 185-pound senior full-back, gained 150 yards of New London's 168 rushing, while Neel clicked on 13 of 22 passes for 125 additional yards.

RON RYBARZCYK tossed five touchdown passes in Oberlin's romp. The Indians covered 337 yards on seven of its passing, six of which went for touchdowns and the other was good for 51 yards to set up another tally.

Rybarczyk connected with Glenn Hodge for scores from 58, 52 and 48 yards out and also passed for 19 yards to Don Ellington and for 43 to John Austin. Hodge passed to Tom Wilbond for 65 yards and another score, while Wilbond raced 15 and 30 yards on runs.

RIDGEVILLE JUMPED off to a 12-0 lead in the opening quarter and held an 18-8 bulge at halftime. However, Huron wiped out the deficit with a touchdown in the third canto and two more in the final stanza.

Dan Deeks raced 69 yards on the second play from scrimmage and Ben Barnett plunged one yard to give the Rangers a 12-0 lead. Bill Seder scored for Huron with 10:33 left in the half on a 20-yard pass from John Perrin to cap a drive of 87 yards.

Barnett again plunged one yard with 2:56 to go in the

half to put Ridgeville on top by an 18-8 margin. Huron took the second half kickoff and marched 65 yards in 14 plays with Perrin passing for the final 14 to

DENNIS ENGLISH plunged one yard in the second period and Leroy Peyton dashed 72 yards in the fourth stanza in Clearview's triumph.
