

Margaretta Loses 18-0 In Championship Bid

Tiffin Calvert stopped Margaretta's bid for a Sandusky Bay Conference championship in its first season by an 18-0 count at rain-swept Columbian Stadium.

Roger Dariano scored three times for the unbeaten Senecas (7-0-2), who copped the 1965 league title in their last season in the conference.

Tough Calvert Defense, Mud Thwarts Polars

Barry Brunner, 185-pound Polar back, was the only effective Margaretta runner, gaining 82 yards in 11 carries, including a 23-yard gainer on the first play of the game. Gant finished with 59 yards, but was thrown for losses totaling 12 yards for a net rushing total of 47 yards. Brunner was also outstanding from his defensive linebacker position.

The first Tiffin score came with 3:37 left in the first quarter when Dariano bulled over from the 3-yard line on the last play of a 15-play drive that covered 66-yards.

A 13-yard passing gain was the key play in the drive, giving Tiffin the ball first and 10 at the Margaretta 27. The half ended with the count only 6-0 against the Polars, but it wasn't long before the scoreboard blinked.

Ricci Reinhart returned Gant's kick-off 24 yards to the Tiffin 41 and on the next play Dariano burst outside and shook off tackler after tackler to zip into paydirt.

Forced to take chances, the Bears attempted to move the pigskin but the tough Calvert defense stopped them cold.

The final TD came with 4:02 left in the game. Dariano battering over from the 3-yard line. Tiffin took control of the ball on the Polars' 14 after Calvert's Jerry Gase broke up a Margaretta pitchout on a fourth down and two situation.

George Reash's gridders were limited to eight first downs. The deepest penetration came in the third quarter when Keegan hit Rick Dayhuff with a 10-yard pass that took the pigskin down to the Tiffin 13, but Margaretta had to pick up 13 on fourth down and was forced to give up the ball on downs at that point.

The loser's finished with a fine 7-2-1 season record, and a third place in the SBC.

Perkins Falls Like Rain

Pirates Drop 18-0 Decision To Lake For Final 2-8 Record

Perkins High closed its dismal 1965 grid campaign with an 18-0 loss to invading Lake Friday night. The Pirates finished with a 2-8 record.

Lake (4-6) scored once in the first quarter and twice in the third to wrap up the contest at the muddy Perkins' gridiron.

The Pirates' small, fast backs couldn't cut or make any headway in the slippery conditions, almost custom made for the likes of Lake's Phil Hollobaugh, Bob Johnson and Vic Rodella.

Hollobaugh scored the first Flyer touchdown, bursting over from the 21-yard-line, after a teammate had scooped up a Perkins' fumble at the Pirate 24.

The next score came in the third quarter, when Rodella, 175-pound junior, blasted over from the two-yard-line.

THE PIRATES still couldn't go, and Lake took over. Johnson zipped over from the 1-yard line to cap a long drive. The TD was set up by a sparkling 23 - yard jaunt by halfback Bob St. John.

Perkins' deepest penetration was down to the Lake 20. Jim Fry, 150 - pound junior halfback, was the most effective Pirate runner, carting the pigskin six times for 40 yards.

BRUCE DAHM, the Pirates' fine junior totter, was held to 31 yards in nine carries. The

hosts racked up only five first downs to eight for the winners.

Ted Schwanger's crew rolled up 92 yards rushing, compared to 186 for Lake,

which never threw a pass all night. Perkins threw three times, but didn't connect on any.

The losers fumbled eight times and lost the pigskin

twice, while Lake didn't commit one ballhandling miscue. Perkins was also hit with six penalties that set it back 70 yards, compared to 5 penalties and 55 yards for Lake.
