Sandusky High's harriers won their second straight cross-country match this year and country match this year and tied for first, tracking the two miles in 10:05. Teammates Jim Collins was fifth, Dave Olson edged Elyria, 21-39, over a muddy Westside Recreation seventh.

Sandusky took over on downs at its 48 to set the next scoring drive in motion.

Keys went 11 on the third play to the visitor's 25, but Healy lost 6 on the next and Eddie Williams was held to 2 yards. Needing 14 yards on third down from the 29, Healy was almost caught rolling left but threw to junior end George Garrett who hauled in the strike on the 6 and went over to make it 36-0.

After the 48-yard scoring pass, Sid Allen sliced over from the 2 for the Big Red, and Goh passed to Gene Kok for the extra points to conclude the scoring.

Plymouth is now 3-2 on the season, and 3-1 in the JAC, while the Cougars are 1-4 overall and 0-4 in the league.

PERKINS TOOK the kickoff, but was held, and had to punt. Big Tom McAllister gave Perkins a chance with 1:26 remaining when the Pirate tackle dropped on a Lutheran fumble.

But the Pirates couldn't go anywhere, losing 5 yards the first play, gaining 8 back on the Pirates' only pass of the night, but losing 13 more when quarterback Harris was caught trying to pass.

Dahm went 4 yards on the next—and last—play, as Perkins failed to nail a first down the whole second half.

DAHM WAS Schwanger's workhorse, carrying on 25 of the 33 rushes from scrimmage, gaining 81 of Perkins' net 93 yards.

Duettmeyer paced West's contingent with 59 yards in 14 carries.

The Hamman twins of Shelby ran invading Bucyrus dizzy Friday night when the Whippets sailed to an easy 47-6 Northern Ohio League victory.

Pudge Hamman scored on runs of 38, 54, 32, and 38 yards, while twin brother Phil scored twice on jaunts of 40 and 42.

LANNY HOPKINS also scored on a 34-yard run as Shelby worked its week side plays to perfection. Hopkins notched the extra points after his touchdown and Carl Pittenger kicked the PAT's.

Bucyrus, which gained only 35 yards all night, scored in the third quarter on a 7-yard run by Mike Burling. Bucyrus is now 0-5 on the season and 0-3 in the loop, while Shelby remains undefeated in five outings.

The Whippets rolled up 522 yards rushing against the hapless Redmen.

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
