

Clear Fork Takes Half-Game Lead In JAC

Loudonville Birds, Northmor In Wins

It may only last for a few hours, but the Clear Fork Colts (6-0 and 7-0) slipped into a slender lead in the Johnny Appleseed Conference football race last night.

The Colts survived their roughest test of the season by nipping Fredericktown (4-2 and 5-2), 12-6, and take a half-game lead over unbeaten, defending champion Ontario.

Ontario (5-0 and 6-0) was scheduled to travel to Lucas (0-5 and 1-5), this afternoon for a 2 o'clock game. An Ontario win would again tie the league lead.

In other JAC action last night, hosting Loudonville (3-3 and 4-3) drubbed Crestline (4-2 and 4-3) 42-12, and Northmor (1-5 and 2-5) upset Plymouth (3-3 and 3-4), 6-0.

Crestview (1-4 and 2-4) is scheduled to meet Lexington (1-4 and 2-4) at Belleville tonight at 8 o'clock.

BELLEVILLE — Clear Fork halfback Steve Walker ran to his right in the third quarter, evaded a Fredericktown defensive lineman, and flipped a nine-yard scoring pass to End Dan Jackson in the end zone to give the undefeated Colts a come-from-behind victory over the visiting Freds.

The Walker-to-Jackson combination had clicked earlier in the contest to give the Colts the equalizer when one of Walker's deflected passes was picked up by Jackson on the Fredericktown five-yard stripe and he then stepped into the end zone.

Both defensive units did outstanding jobs before the Clear Fork Dad's Night capacity crowd as each line held for only short running plays during the JAC game of the week.

Fredericktown's brief lead came with 8:37 remaining in the second quarter when it elected to gamble on a fourth-and-one situation at the Clear Fork 49-yard marker. Gregg Shaffer raced to the Colts' 39-yard line and three plays later Jim Cateau blasted up the middle on a 28-yard scoring run to cap a six-play, 54-yard drive.

Both squads battled down to the final gun as the Colts stopped Fredericktown desperation passes in the closing moments when alert Clear Fork defensive halfback Roger Bowers intercepted a toss on the Colts' five-yard line and raced down to the midfield stripe to stop the visitors.

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C.K. Yang Criticized At 'Home'

LOS ANGELES (AP) — C.K. Yang, holder of the world decathlon record, says he may renounce his Chinese national citizenship if criticism of him continues in Taipei newspapers.

Yang, 32, now a public relations man for a wine firm and a part-time track coach, says he is happy in the United States.

But he adds he has no desire to renounce his Chinese citizenship unless hostile public opinion in Formosa makes him an exile.

Yang to a reporter that his countrymen are angry because he has decided to live with his American-born wife, Daisy, 28, and their two sons in the United States.

SECOND TO RAFAER — In 1958, Yang was sent to the United States, sponsored by the Chinese Track and Field Association, to prepare for the 1960 Rome Olympics. He placed second behind the United States' Rafer Johnson at Rome.

Yang returned to Los Angeles with a scholarship from the Taipei government, and attended UCLA, Johnson's alma mater.

In 1963 Yang scored 9,121 points at a Mt. San Antonio College track meet to set the world's decathlon record.

But three days prior to the 1964 Olympics at Tokyo he came down with stomach flu. He recovered in time to compete, but finished fifth.

Criticism of his performance flared in the Formosan press.
