

St. Louis Cardinals Blank Reds, 4 To 0

The St. Louis Cardinals continue their march toward the 1967 National League pennant.

They routed the Cincinnati

Reds, 4-0, Friday night behind Steve Carlton's two-hit pitching and a three-run homer by Mike Shannon. Carlton himself drove in the other St. Louis run.

"Carlton pitched a very fine game," Manager Red Schoendienst said later.

Over in the Reds' dressing room, Manager Dave Bristol agreed. "He must have had something on the ball, for we kept popping it up," the Reds manager said.

The Reds got only one clean hit off the 22-year-old southpaw — a first-inning single by Tommy Helms.

The Cardinals had little trouble hitting an assortment of Reds' pitchers, but broke through only in the third inning. Starter Gary Nolan walked Bob Tolan and Tim McCarver and Shannon followed with his 12th homer.

Julian Javier was up next and doubled. He scored on Carlton's single to center and Nolan left the game.

CLOSE MATCH

In other National League games, Chicago defeated Atlanta, 7-1; San Francisco defeated Pittsburgh 6-3 and Los Angeles edged Philadelphia in a pair of 1-0 games.

Ferguson Jenkins, who has played a major role in the rise of the Cubs this season, had to struggle against the Braves. The Cubs actually put the game away in the first inning as Ron Santo and Ernie Banks drove in three runs with a pair of doubles.

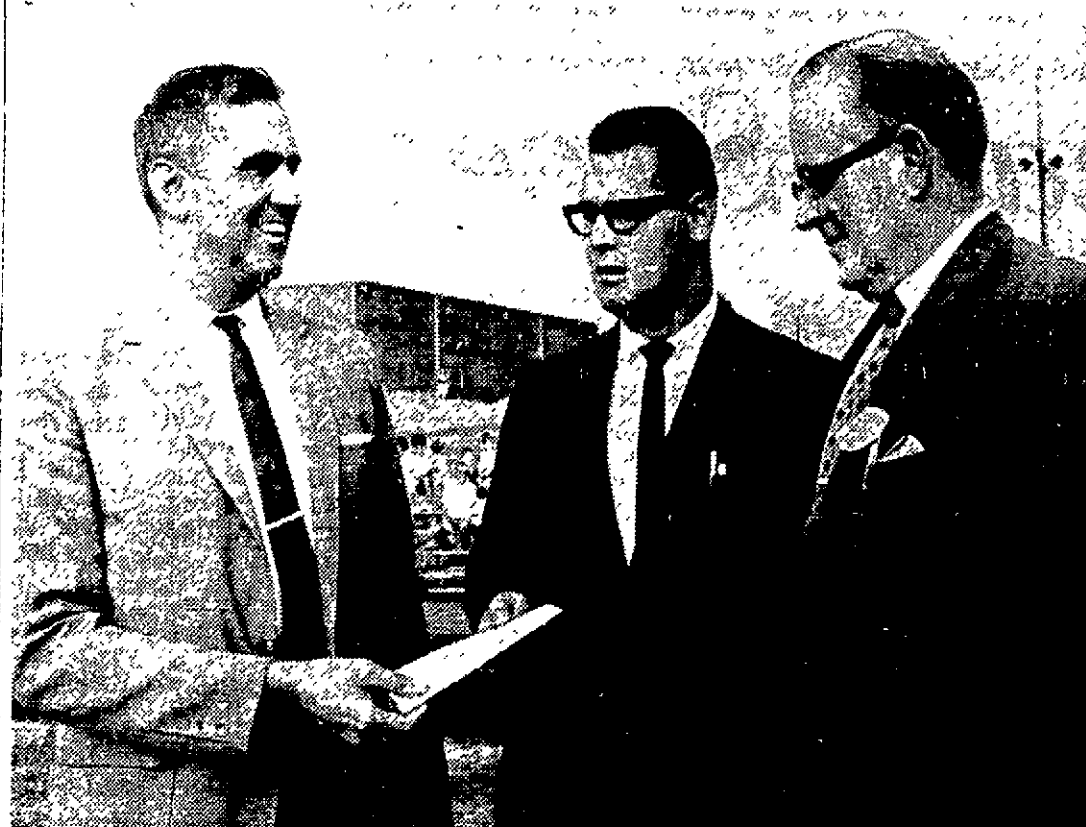

Galion High Tigers Caged By Roosevelt

KENT — Kent Roosevelt's football team rolled for 364 yards on the ground here last night in pulverizing Galion, 42-0.

Kent (2-0) put eight points on the scoreboard in the first quarter and then broke the game wide open with a 22-point outburst in the second period to take a 30-0 halftime lead.

Tom Campana, with 163 yards gained rushing in the first half and 27 in the second, was the big man for the winning Riders. Campana raced 65 and 63 yards for two second-period touchdowns and then added a third six-yard point in the third quarter.

Stan White scored the first Kent touchdown with 6:44 remaining in the opening quarter when he picked a blocked punt out of the air on the Galion 22-yard line and trotted into the end zone. White also took a 12-yard scoring pass from Stan Boykin in the second period.

Galion, winless and scoreless in two outings, was held to 26 yards rushing in the first half and 27 in the second. The Tigers passed for 99 yards, completing four of 12 attempts. Galion lost the ball four times on fumbles.

WEST SALEM — Mike Grenert accounted for 30 points in leading the Northwestern High School Huskies (2-0) to a 36-6 football win over Loudonville (1-1) here yesterday.

Grenert scored on a one-yard plunge, threw touchdown passes at 15, 40 and 50 yards to Jim Bowersock and ran for all six of Northwestern's points after touchdowns.

Steve Allender scored Loudonville's only touchdown in the second stanza on a seven-yard pass from Rex Messner. Loudonville threatened on the one-yard line after a 64-yard drive, but the ball was fumbled.

Ed Franks ran for 126 of Northwestern's 426 yards in 34 carries.

LOUDONVILLE — Visiting Avon (2-0) pushed across one touchdown in the second quarter and two in the final period to shackle South Central (1-1) last night, 22-0, in a high school football game.
