

Lorain King Sinks Mansfield Tygers, 20-6

Bengals' Passing Attack Bogs Down

LORAIN — Mansfield Senior High's passing attack was stymied by a rugged Lorain Admiral King defense as the Tygers dropped their first Buckeye Conference game here last night, 20-6.

Mansfield Seniors (2-3 and 1-1), which depends on its passing attack to provide the spark on offense, gained just 65 yards through the air against LAK's defense, which was obviously prepared for the aerials.

The Tygers failed to complete a pass in just three tries in the first half. They completed just four of 14 in the second half and had two intercepted. Substitute quarterback Rick Wright connected on three of six attempts for 63 yards in the final minutes of play.

Although Mansfield Senior's passing attack bogged down, its defense stopped LAK until the third period when the Admirals tied the score. LAK scored twice in the fourth period to win the game.

LAK TESTED the Tiger defense with just two passes, both incomplete. The Admirals gained 305 yards rushing and picked up all 17 first downs along the ground.

Admiral King (3-2 and 1-1) scored its winning touchdown with 9:06 to play in the game. The Admirals took a poor Mansfield punt on the Tygers' 36 and nine plays later sophomore Larry Barnes bolted over from three yards out to make it 12-6. Barnes, a speedster, led the Admirals in rushing with 92 yards in 21 carries.

LAK put the game out of reach with its third TD with just over a minute left to play. Th Admirals drove 67 yards with Fullback Bob Wolfe eating up the last 19 in one play for the score.

A ROUGHING-the-kicker penalty, which kept the LAK drive alive, was perhaps the key play in the game. The Admirals punted from their own 41 and the short kick went out-of-bounds at Mansfield's 48 with seven minutes to play. But the penalty gave the Admirals a first down at the Tiger 44.

The Tygers scored in the first quarter on a 96-yard drive. They recovered John Beard's fumble at the four and scored 15 plays later on Quarterback Dave Hall's 26-yard run with 44 seconds left in the opening period. The march was sparked by the running of Hallabrin and Phillips. Not one pass was thrown in the drive.

MANSFIELD led 6-0 at halftime, but Admiral King tied the score in the third period. Barnes highlighted the 66-yard drive with a 22-yard run to the Mansfield eight and three plays later Beard scored on a plunge with 5:37 remaining in the third stanza.

The Admirals had two other scoring threats. They reached the Mansfield nine-yard line in the second period before a clipping penalty set them back. In the third quarter, Ron Skarupa ran for a touchdown with an interception.

ST. LOUIS (AP) — The Boston Red Sox, all even with St. Louis at a game apiece in the World Series, feel they're at no disadvantage in meeting the Cardinals for three straight games at Busch Stadium.

"This team wasn't tailored for Fenway Park in Boston," Dick Williams, the Red Sox' rookie manager, said today before the start of the third game in the 64th fall classic.

"We've played well on the road all season," Williams said. "And we've played winning ball with every move in the book — walks, bunts, a steal, a double steal — everything all year long. The park doesn't make any difference with our style of play."

In former years, the Red Sox tried to pack their line-up with right-handed power to capitalize on Boston's chummy left field wall. As a re-
