

Sandusky Streaks Race Past Mansfielders

Tygers Lose Last Contest, 48 To 12

SANDUSKY — It was expected that Eddie Williams would have a fine night as he ended his brilliant career at Sandusky. He did.

The 5-11, 200-pound halfback rushed for 185 yards in 22 carries and scored three touchdowns and four extra points. Thus he passed his brother, Stew, as the top ground-gainer in Sandusky's modern day history.

The typical performance by Williams was a tremendous show of brute strength and agility, but it was three other "easy" scores that put Mansfield Senior out of contention in its 4412 loss to the Blue Streaks here last night.

Quarterback Dan Miller of Sandusky threw just four passes. The first was intercepted, but the other three were completed, two for touchdowns to Tom Darden, who is an All-Ohio candidate along with Williams. The Sandusky defense scored the final TD when Tackle Dave Wobser picked off a Mansfield fumble in mid-air and rambled nine yards.

A much smaller Mansfield team surprised the crowd of 7,500 at Strobel Field by defeating the machine-like Blue Streaks at 6-6 after one quarter. The Tygers scored on Dave Hallabrin's 14-yard pass to End Don Blakey, who cut across the unguarded middle of the Sandusky defense.

Williams, who scored the first Sandusky TD, then raced for two more scores within two minutes in the second period and it was 22-6. The Tygers came back, though, and Dave Phillips plunged in from one yard away to cut the gap to 22-12 with 1:01 to play in the half.

Williams, who did almost everything for Sandusky including punt and kick-off, returned the following Mansfield kick-off to the Tygers' 38. On the first play, Miller threw 38 yards to Darden, who caught the ball at the goal line. This score made it 28-12 and was a turning point in the game.

The Blue Streaks scored twice in the third period and that was all of the scoring. The fourth TD came on Miller's 25-yard aerial to Darden on a third- and 16 situation. On Mansfield's first play after the next kick-off, Wobser grabbed the fumble and zipped in for an easy six points and it was 44-12 with still 6:05 left in the third stanza.

MANSFIELD had three other scoring threats. With the score tied 6-6, Shawn Madison intercepted Miller's pass to put the Tygers at the Sandusky 44. Hallabrin's 18-yard pass to Blakey put the ball at the Blue Streaks' 16, but a pass on fourth down from the eight fell incomplete.

On the second play of the fourth period, with the score 44-12, Hill went five yards for an apparent score on the end-around. However, a penalty nullified the TD and a pass on fourth down failed to net the yardage needed for the score.

Mansfield used up the last 3:27 of the game driving from

Plymouth went ahead for the first time in the fourth quarter with three minutes remaining when Hoffman burst around right side from a shotgun formation from 24 yards out to make the score 12-8.

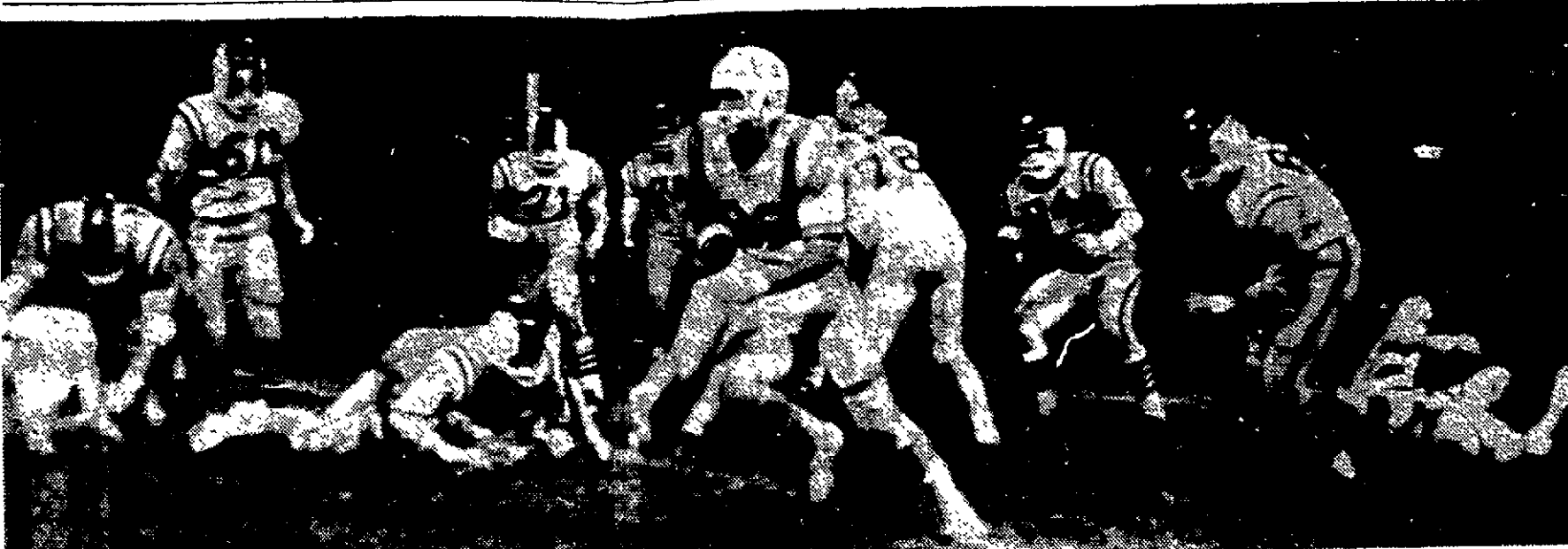
A fake punt on South Central's 48-yard line set up the final TD as Plymouth gained 18 yards on the play.

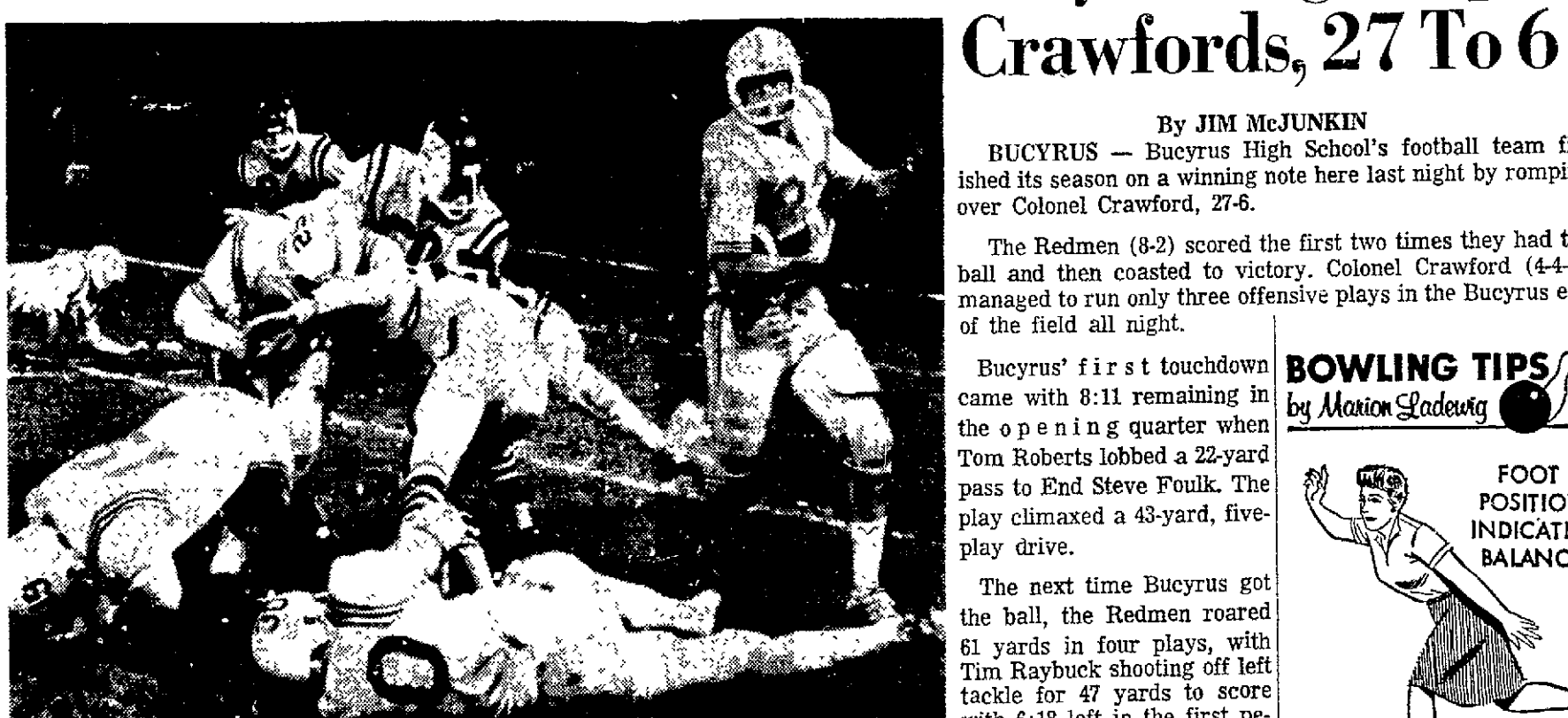
