

This was part of the reaction on the dayafter for St. Paul Coach Mike Gottfried. His Flyers Saturday night beat Plymouth 28-6 to finish an unbeaten season.

The St. Paul Mentor, a star quarterback for Morehead State (Ky.) during his college days, reviewed the successful season, in which St. Paul "played as hard as they had to to win."


