Daniel, a Lorain resident for 71 years, was killed as he was leaving to make his new home near Sarasota, Fla.

Born in Peterhead, Scotland in 1887, Daniel's family moved to Cleveland shortly thereafter. He became a resident of Lorain in 1898, graduated from Lorain High School and went on to star in many sports at Ohio Wesleyan University.

One of the most respected athletic directors in Ohio, George Daniel Football Field here was named after him.



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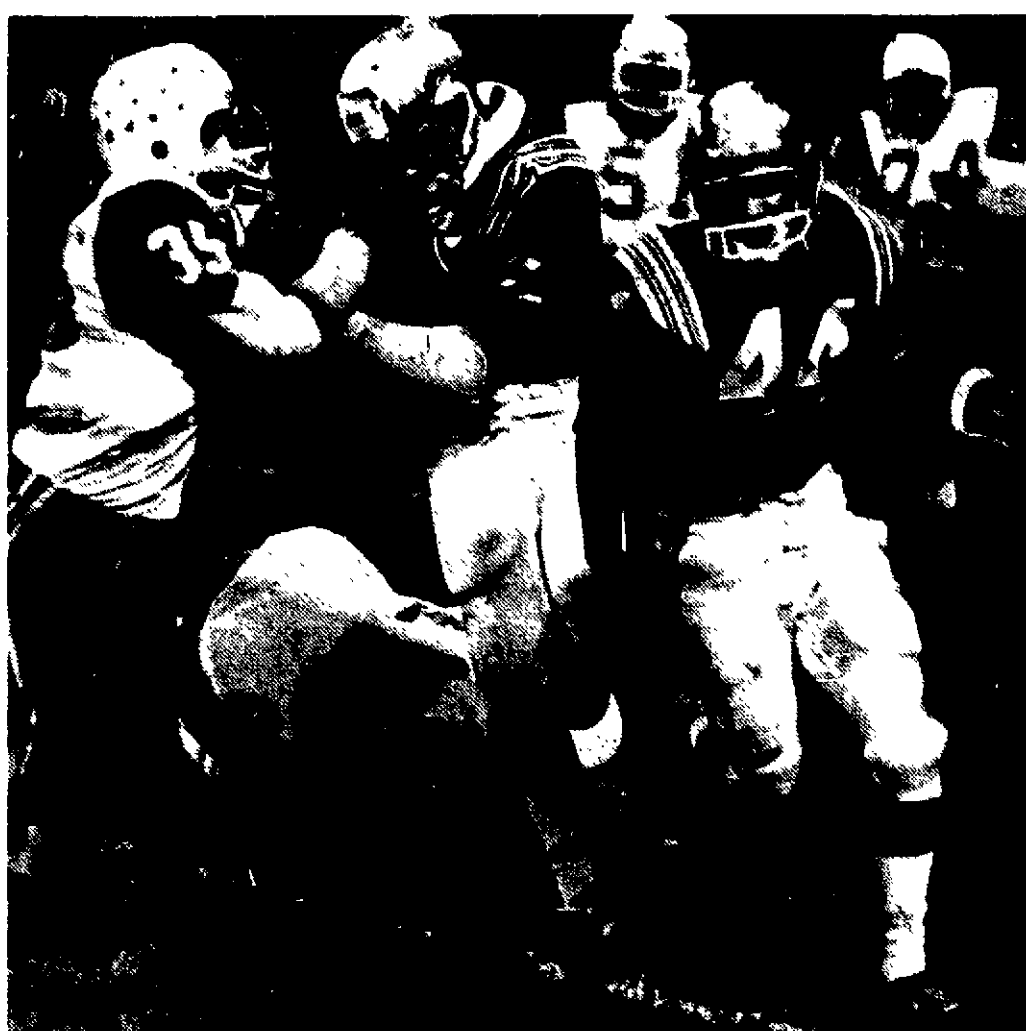

Lindy's Pride Wins Again In Trotting

WESTBURY, N. Y. (AP) — Kenny Ross, a self - styled "little country boy come to the big city," still was thrilled today at how close he came to scoring one of harness racing's biggest upsets.

"I thought I should have won it," said the 42 - year - old Ross of Pittsburgh, Pa., after his furious stretch charge with Crain Hanover to finish second to Lindy's Pride in the \$173,455 Dexter Cup Trot at Roosevelt Raceway Friday night.

Lindy's Pride, who has succeeded the retired Nevele Pride as the king of trotters in the United States, won the richest trotting race of the year by two lengths in 2:03 3-5 for the mile.

It was the ninth straight victory for Lindy's Pride, a three - year - old colt owned by the Lindy Farm of Lindenhurst, N. Y., and gave him a sweep of the Big Five of trotting, he Yonkers Futurity, the Hambletonian, the Colonial, the Kentucky Futurity and the Dexter. Only Nevele Pride previously had accomplished a sweep of the Big Five.
