# Toledo Rogers Beats Senior High, 14 to 0

Toledo Rogers continued its mastery of Buckeye Conference football opposition by pinning a 14-0 defeat on the Mansfield Tygers last night at Arlin Field.

Rogers (2-0) pushed across touchdowns in the second and third quarters against the fangless Tygers before 3,500 fans. Hard-working Dan Caywood scored the first on a one-yard burst and Kevin Wolff passed five yards to Craig Cornachione for the second Lask week, Rogers had opponent with a 7-0 victory over Fremont Ross of the Buckeye. 
off 21 yards to the 30, the Tygers moved 55 yards in eight plays to the Rogers' 15. The drive died there.

Stillwell carried three times for 43 of the yards. Two of his gainers were sparkling efforts of 20 and 21 yards. He finished with a net of 40 yards in seven efforts.

Caywood, the 174-pound Rogers captain, carried on 30 of Rogers' 48 ground plays from scrimmage. He gained a net of 123 yards. In the last quarter, the Rogers' signal caller apparently knew only Caywood's number. He carried 15 times in that period and in two strings was the ball lugger in six of seven plays.

Caywood scored the first Toledo touchdown on the sixth play of a 40-yard march. The second came on a seven-play, 45-yard march when Wolff zeroed in on Cornachione all alone in the end zone Wolff hit on three passes for 41 of the 45 yards.
