TRENTON, N. J. (UPI) — Al Unser, who already owns the 1970 Indianapolis 500 title and the USAC driving championship, won the rain-shortened Trenton 300 at Trenton Speedway Saturday.

The 31-year-old Unser had a full lap lead over the field when a downpour during the 176th lap forced officials to call the race.

His time for the distance — 264 miles on the 1½ mile track was an average record speed of 137.5 miles per hour.

Bobby Unser was in second place when the race was stopped. Mike Mosley of Brownsburg, Ind., finished third, followed by Johnny Rutherford of Fort Worth, Tex., and Roger McCluskey of Tucson, Ariz.

Final Connection Pays Off In 20-17 Longhorn Victory

AUSTIN, Tex. (UPI) — Texas quarterback Eddie Phillips, plagued for 59 minutes and 48 seconds by missed pitchouts, crucial fumbles and a vicious UCLA defense, found his gambler's luck for only one play in the fourth quarter Saturday.

But that one shot was enough as Phillips hit End Cotton Speyrer with a 45-yard touchdown pass with 12 seconds left in the game. Second - ranked Texas took a 20-17 victory over the upset-minded Bruins.

The freckle - faced quarterback had fumbled away the ball at the UCLA seven yard line in the third period, and the Californians marched 93 yards for their go - ahead touchdown that made an upset appear all but certain.

But facing a third - and - 19 at the UCLA 45 and only 12 seconds still on the clock, Speyrer started deep, was cut off by a Bruin defender, then "improvised" by cutting toward the left sideline, taking Phillips' pass on the 20, and racing into the end

zone, half a step ahead of a UCLA tackler.

The desperation touchdown overcame a record - breaking passing performance by UCLA quarterback Dennis Dummitt who completed 19 of 30 passes for 340 yards and two third period touchdowns which put UCLA ahead 17-13.

But Texas got possession with just 46 seconds remaining and, as time ran out Phillips hit Speyrer streaking down the sideline for the winning touchdown.

UCLA had thwarted Texas' famed triple option offense all afternoon, Dummitt rattled the Texas defense in the second half with 15 of 17 completions including a pair of 11 yard touchdown throws to Jerry Vernory and Bob Christansen.

Allen Lowry intercepted a Dummitt pass with eight

seconds remaining to erase the Bruin's last possible chance for an upset.
