

Clear Fork Edges Ontario, 14 to 8

The Clear Fork High School Colts all but knocked Ontario out of contention for the Johnny Appleseed Conference football title last night in one of two scheduled loop games.

The Colts (3-3 in JAC and 3-5 overall) came from behind to defeat Ontario (4-2 and 4-3-1) by a 14-8 count. Fredericktown (2-4 and 4-4) burst into sole possession of sixth place, 36-6 over Plymouth (1-5 and 3-5).

Two afternoon games

were slated today with undefeated Crestline (5-0 and 7-0) traveling to Lexington (4-1 and 4-3) and Crestview (0-5 and 1-6) hosting Loudonville (3-2 and 4-3).

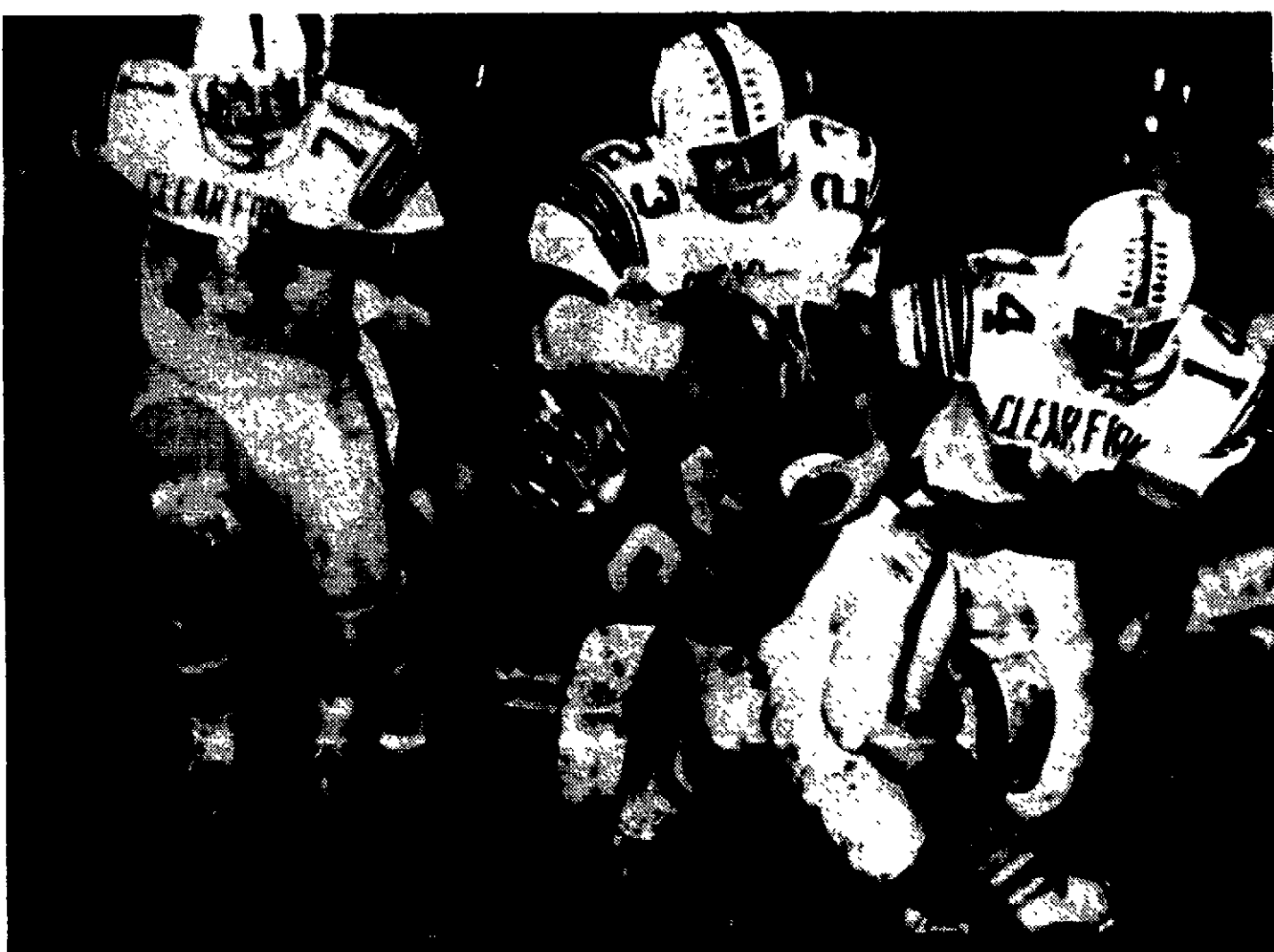
Race Pilot Dies

Cincinnati Royals Smash Cavaliers

CLEVELAND (AP) — Round one of a new interstate rivalry for Ohio sports fans ended Friday with the Cincinnati Royals whipping the Cleveland Cavaliers 125-110 in a National Basketball Assn. game.

A sparse crowd of 3,199 saw the first regular season meeting between the two teams. The victory was Cincinnati's third straight after five losses at the start of the season and the loss was the ninth for the winless Cavaliers, an expansion team.

Veteran Johnny Green came off the Royals' bench with Cleveland leading 51-48 in the second quarter and scored 12 points to give Cincinnati a 62-55 halftime bulge.

"Johnny Green had the key hoops and the key rebounds in the second quarter that turned the game around," Royals' Coach Bob Cousy said. "He's won more game for us the last two years than anyone else on the team. I wait for the tempo to slow down and then I put him in."

FAST FINISH

Dick Van Arsdale popped in 12 points in the third period as Cincinnati upped the lead to 92-76. Norm Van Lier then killed any comeback hopes of Cleveland as he scored 17 of his 23 points in the final quarter.

The balanced Cincinnati attack found Van Arsdale totaling 20 points, Charlie Paulk, 19, Green 17, Sam Lacey, 14, Bob Arnszen 11 and Flynn Robinson 10. It was Robinson's first appearance after ending a long holdout.

The Cavaliers got 24 points from John Warren and 21 apiece from Rookie John Johnson and Luther Rackley.
