CLEVELAND (AP) - Round one of a new interstate rivalry for Ohio sports fans ended Friday with the Cincinnati Royals whiping the Cleveland Cavaliers 125-110 in a National Basketball Assn. game.

A sparse crowd of 3,199 saw the first regular season meeting between the two teams. The victory was Cincinnati's third straight after five losses at the start of the season and the loss was the ninth for the winless Cavaliers, an expansion team.

Veteran Johnny Green came off the Royals' bench with Cleveland leading 51-48 in the second quarter and scored 12 points to give Cin-cinnati a 62-55 h a l f t i m e bulge.

"Johnny Green had the key hoops and the key rebounds in the second quarter that turned the game around," Royals' Coach Bob Cousy said. "He's won more game for us the last two years than anyone else on the team. I wait for the tempo to slow down and then I put him in."




