8 Shutouts In A Row Over West Tech

Elyria Rebounds

Buckeye Conference football teams fared much better last night than they did a week ago when five of the six clubs in action registered victories.

However, Findlay suffered a stunning setback at the hands of Cleveland Holy Name, 10-0. The Trojans opened their campaign last week with a smashing 34-15 win over Springfield South.

ELYRIA HAD no trouble with longtime patsy, Cleveland West in a 28-0 romp, while Lorain Admiral King outscored Cleveland John Adams, 48-22, and Marion posted a 34-16 win over Cleveland East Tech, and Fremont shaded Cleveland Lincoln, 16-8. Sandusky halted still another Cleveland entry, East High's Bombers, 28-14.

Elyria blanked West Tech for the eighth year in a row, and the 13th time in the 17-year series. The Pioneers have allowed West Tech just 28 points in the entire series, and lost one game by a 2-0 margin.

THE PIONEERS, who had a 21-game win streak snapped last week in a startling 7-6 loss to Toledo Scott, struck for a pair of touchdowns in the first period. Barry Eison rambled 27 yards, then quarterback John Gawik dashed 13 yards three plays after Don Robinson blocked a West Tech punt which gave Elyria possession on the visitors' eight.

In the second stanza, Gawik rifled a 30-yard touchdown pass to Tom Haney on the final play of the first half. Eison tallied the last score in the third quarter. Dave Sexton kicked the PAT after each Elyria score.

The hosts rushed for 190 yards compared to only four for West Tech, but the invaders went to the air 25 times and completed 11 tosses for 121 yards.

Both clubs fumbled five times and Elyria has now had the pigskin shaken from runners on 11 occasions in just two games.

ADMIRAL KING came up with a sharp passing attack with quarterbacks Mark Lukesic and Don Fritz sharing the duties.

The Admirals, blanked in their opening test, gained a whopping 295 yards in the air with 11 of 19 for the veterans. They also added 104 yards on the ground for a combined total of 399 yards.

RICK HUDDLE AND Roger Chase each registered a pair of touchdowns as Marion Harding nabbed its second win of the young season.

Huddle sprinted 14 yards with 4:03 left

in the first half to give Marion a 21-8 lead at intermission, that concluded the scoring for the Presidents with a four-yard burst on the second play of the final period.

Chase gave the hosts a quick lead with a five-yard thrust at the 8:11 mark and returned to paydirt in the third quarter following an electrifying 69-yard punt return.

Andy Jones tallied both East Tech markers, on runs of one and six yards.

FINDLAY WAS its own worst enemy. The Trojans lost four fumbles and had one pass intercepted and just couldn't get untracked.

Holy Name grabbed a 7-0 lead in the first period on Mickey Day's one-yard plunge and Greg Godec's placement. It remained that way until Godec added the frosting with a 25-yard field goal in the fourth canto.

Findlay managed a meager 105 yards in total offense, while Holy Name rushed for 263 yards alone and only three lost fumbles kept the Cleveland 11 from hiking the margin.

THE PRESENCE of injured halfback Tom Liggins in the lineup sparked the Little Giants to victory as the All-Buckeye performer broke an 8-8 tie in the third stanza for the eventual deciding points.

Liggins, who received a leg injury, was a doubtful starter as early as this morning, but the fleet-footed played and turned in a remarkable job.

Cleveland Lincoln West went on the board first when Steve Carleris carried the pigskin in from eight yards out with a pass from Vance Pate to Joe Pagen giving the invaders an 8-0 advantage.

THE HOSTS CAME back and closed the margin 8-6 on a seven-yard jaunt by Rob Lyle and a run by Ben Lopez tied the game.

Lopez also scored the points after when Liggins hit paydirt in the third stanza.

Fremont also had three punts blocked, but the invaders were unable to take advantage of the mistakes.

Now 1-1, the Little Giant return to action Friday when they host Toledo Bowsher.

Monroeville Guilty Of 4 Big Mistakes, Plymouth Cashes In

Plymouth cashed in on a rash of Monroeville mistakes to claim a 24-0 decision Friday night, marking the second week in a row the Big Red have blanked a Firelands Conference opponent.

Coach Larry Root's inspired squad scored touchdowns in each quarter.

THE FIRST SCORE came on a 70-yard march in 15 plays after recovering a Monroeville fumble. Quarterback Mike Beard plunged the final yard at the 3:24 mark.

Plymouth drove 84 yards in 12 plays to make the count 12-0 with 8:56 left in the first half. John Conley, who contributed a 36-yard gallop in the march, picked off a seven-yard scoring pass from Beard for the six points.

The Johnny Appleseed Conference representatives controlled the first half, allowing the Eagles a mere 33 yards in total offense.

IN FACT, Monroeville was unable to get inside Plymouth's 20 despite the fact there was a 65-yard pass play in the second half.

Plymouth had a 45-yard scoring play called back late in the first half by a penalty. Beard and Conley had combined on a spectacular aerial only to have holding detected.

In the third period, the hosts recovered a Monroeville fumble 34 yards from the end zone... one play later it was 18-0. Beard and Conley hooked up again for the

distance on the very first play with exactly five minutes remaining in the quarter.

THE FINAL touchdown came in the opening minute of the fourth stanza as Bill Van Wagner rambled 12 yards. Once again the Big Red took advantage of a Monroeville miscue. The Eagles fumbled a Plymouth punt on their own seven and two plays later Van Wagner was in.

"Everything just went haywire for us," Monroeville Coach Don Graham stated. "We made four major mistakes and they capitalized on each one of them, and 115 yards in penalties sure did help us, the youthful Eagle mentor added.

"We came out down 12-0 in the second half and seemed to be ready to play football and marched down the field, but then another fumble came and it certainly hurt us," Graham concluded.

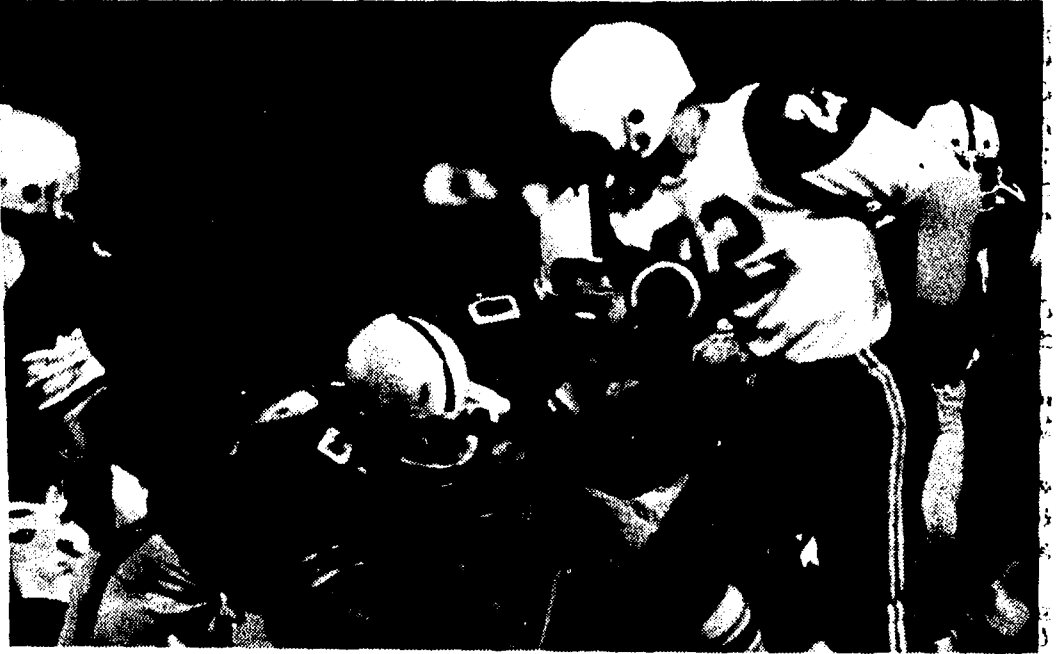
Plymouth gets its first big test of the

Injuries Bring Best In Pirates

It seems as if the more the Pittsburgh Pirates hurt, the better they play.

The Pirates, leaders in the National League's Eastern Division, opened a four-game series in New York Friday night with first baseman Al Oliver sidelined with an injury. Bob Robertson took his place and ignited a three-run inning with his 27th homer of the season to lead the Pirates to a 3-2 victory over the Mets.

"That's the story of this team all season," said Pittsburgh manager Danny Murtaugh. "We've been hit hard by injuries but it seems that the player we put in always does better than the man he replaces."

Robertson broke a scoreless pitching duel between Pittsburgh's Steve Blass and New York's Jim McAndrew in the seventh inning when he followed Willie Stargell's leadoff single with a towering home run. One strike later, Jose Pagan homered to give the Pirates a 3-0 lead.

Blass faltered in the eighth, allowing two runs before being bailed out by relief ace Dave Giusti, who recorded his 25th save.

The victory left the Pirates a game and a half ahead of the second place Chicago Cubs, who swept a two-night doubleheader from Montreal, 3-2 and 5-4, and two and one half ahead of the Mets, who dropped their third game in a row.

In other National League action, Philadelphia beat St. Louis 9-7, Cincinnati ripped Atlanta 11-6, Los Angeles nipped Houston 3-2, and San Francisco beat San Diego 3-2.

Ferguson Jenkins became a 20-winner for the fourth consecutive year in the opener and Ron Santo singled home the winning run in the 10th inning of the second game as the Cubs downed the Expos.

Jenkins pitched a five-hitter in the first game and received support from Billy Williams' home run. Santo singled in Don Kessinger, who doubled and advanced on an infield out, for the winning run in the second game. Williams also homered in that game, tying Ernie Banks' club mark of 41.

Deron Johnson's seventh-inning home run, his 27th of the season, lifted the Phillies over the Cardinals. Johnson's homer snapped a 6-6 tie. Vic Davalillo of St. Louis set a NL pinch-hitting record in the eighth when he singled home Ted Simmons, with his 23rd pinch-hit of the season.

Johnny Bench's three-run homer — his 45th of the season — capped a six-run seventh-inning outburst that led Cincinnati over Atlanta. Bobby Tolan also drove in three runs for the Reds, who made their first appearance after winning the Western Division title without playing on Thursday.

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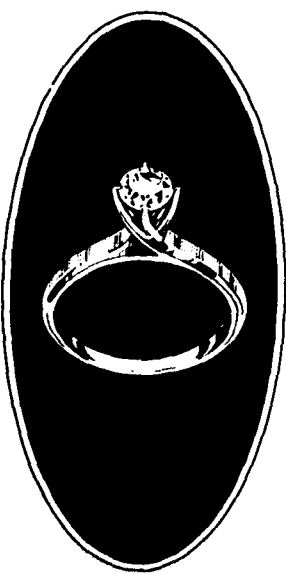
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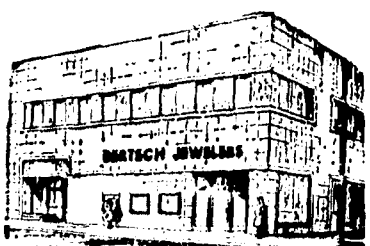
