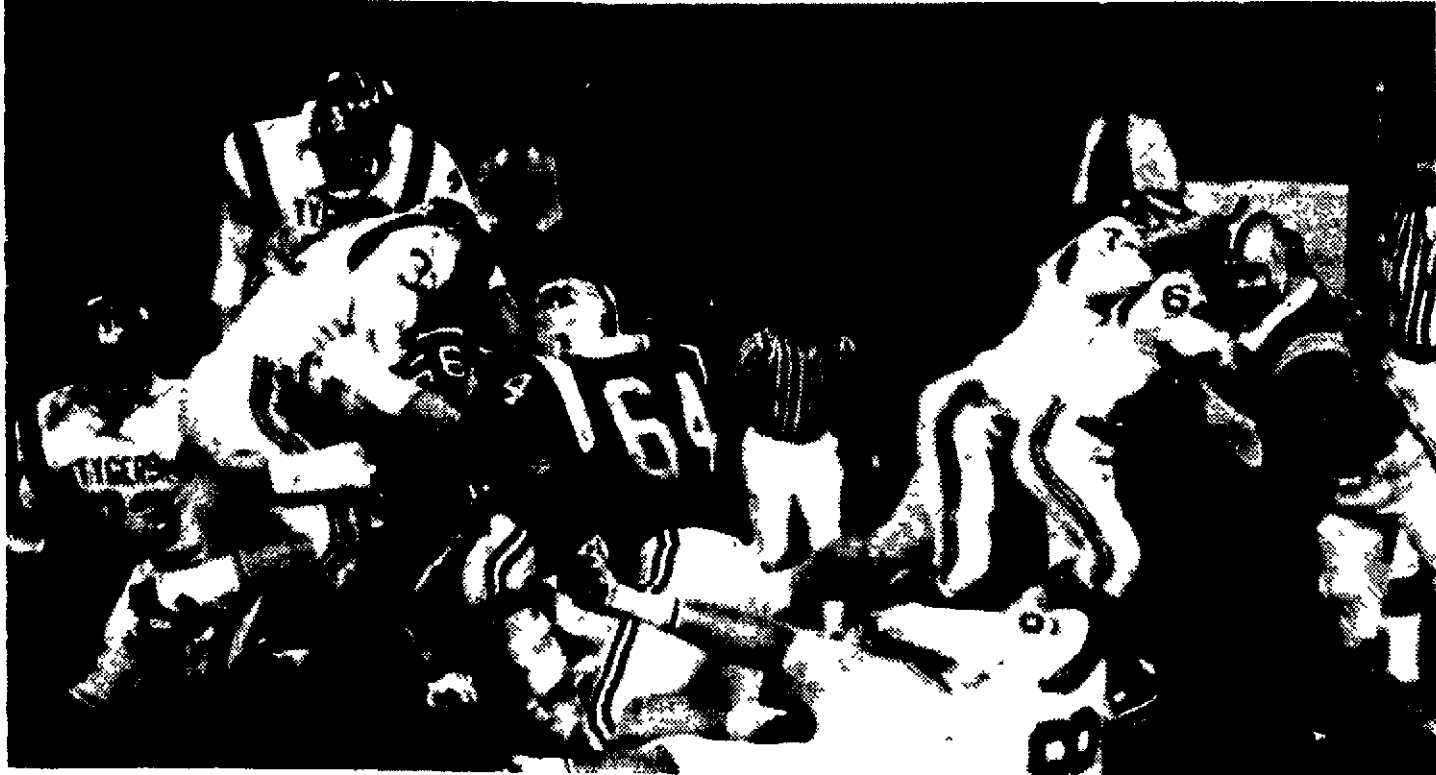

King 'Boots' Tygers, 9-7

A 52-yard razzle-dazzle pass play almost turned Mansfield Senior High's football Homecoming into a delightful occasion, but Lorain Admiral King's Ed Santos labeled it a nightmare with one powerful thrust of his right leg.

The 145-pound junior broke the hearts of the Mansfield faithful last night at Arlin Field when he soccer-kicked a 26-yard field goal with 1:04 showing on the scoreboard clock to give Admiral King a 9-7 victory over the Tygers.

Mansfield seemingly had won the Buckeye Conference duel with a bit of now-or-never fourth-quarter trickery that thrilled most of the 3,000 in attendance.

Trailing 6-0 with 3:23 left in the game, the Tygers resorted to a "flea-flicker" play they had unveiled successfully last week in a losing cause against Fremont Ross

With the ball on the Mansfield 48-yard line, Quarterback Ron Castle fired a pop pass over the line to End Keith Shulko. The Tyger flanker quickly lateraled the ball to Halfback Ray Webb and — whoosh! — Webb was sprinting gaily across the goal line with the tying six points. Greg Yokum kicked the extra point to give Senior a 7-6 advantage with 3:15 remaining.

Unawed by the sudden change of events, the Admirals, with Quarterback Mark Lukesic calling the shots, took the kickoff and marched to the Mansfield six-yard line in six plays.

Lukesic, on second down, ran out of bounds on the 10 to stop the clock. A third-down pass fell incomplete, setting
