

Crestline, Freddie's Split Lead in JAC

The Johnny Applesseed Conference lost half of its leaders in a full action slate of football last night. Fredericktown and Crestline retaining their roles as front-runners.

The Freddie's (2-0 in JAC and 2-2 overall) walloped Lexington (0-1-1 and 0-3-1) by a 28-6 margin while the Bulldogs (2-0 and 3-1) slipped past Plymouth (0-2 and 1-3), 32-28. Ontario (1-0-1 and 2-0-2) held its course one-half game behind the leaders by a healthy 29-6 margin over previously undefeated Loudonville (1-1 and 3-1), 29-6 and Clear Fork (1-1 and 1-3) broke into the win column by a 44-0 whitewash against winless Crestview (0-2 and 0-4).

ONTARIO — Senior runners Dick Kaber and Bob Shafer logged 245 of Ontario's 320 net ground yards here last night and accounted for all but one of the Warriors' points.

Shafer, who picked up 113 yards on 11 carries, took care of the entire first-half scoring, sweeping 24 yards into the end zone with 9:32 left in the initial period and adding a seven-yard bolt at 2:08 of the second. His third touchdown came from 42-yards out with 2:57 remaining in the game.

Kaber wound up with 132 yards after lugging the ball 14 times and highlighted his performance on a 66-yard run in the final stanza.

The only Red Bird to taste paydirt was Halfback Bob Donelson when he ran

around the right side from eight yards to cap an 80-yard march. Ontario scoring drives covered 36, 73, 64 and 44 yards respectively.

Bob Taylor and Donelson led the Loudonville attack. Taylor doing yeoman work for 66 yards on 16 carries and Donelson adding 65 on nine.

The Red Birds' first game possession lasted two plays before Shafer intercepted a pass from Loudonville quarterback Ron Zook at the 36. Four plays later, Shafer scored his initial six-pointer and added a running conversion to give Ontario the only points it needed.

The blasts of fireworks, signifying a Clear Fork High School touchdown, flowed freely over the field as the Colts sped to their first victory, blanking Crestview.

The Colts might have even run the score above the final tally were it not for 105 yards in penalties and seven fumbles, five of which they recovered.

Crestview, unable to sustain a drive at any point in the game, fell victim to three pass interceptions and three lost fumbles. The Cou-

Fullback Lee Knapp accounted for two of Clear Fork's touchdowns, scoring the first with 58 seconds remaining in the first quarter after the Colts drove from the Crestview 27. He scored once more in the third frame after a Cougar fumble set up a 20-yard scoring drive.

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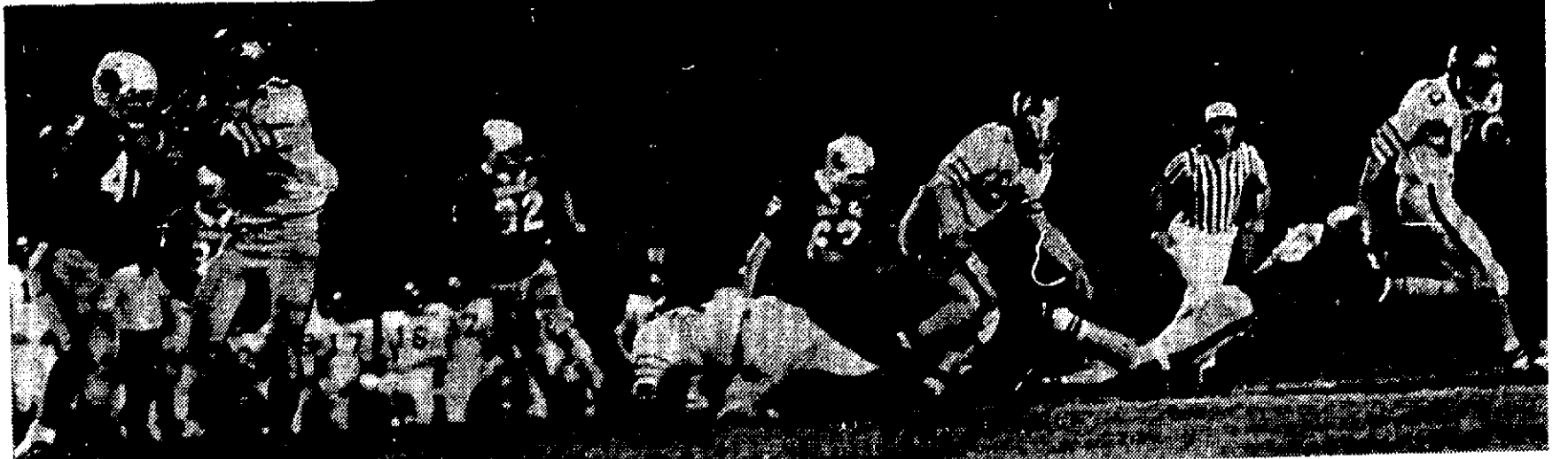
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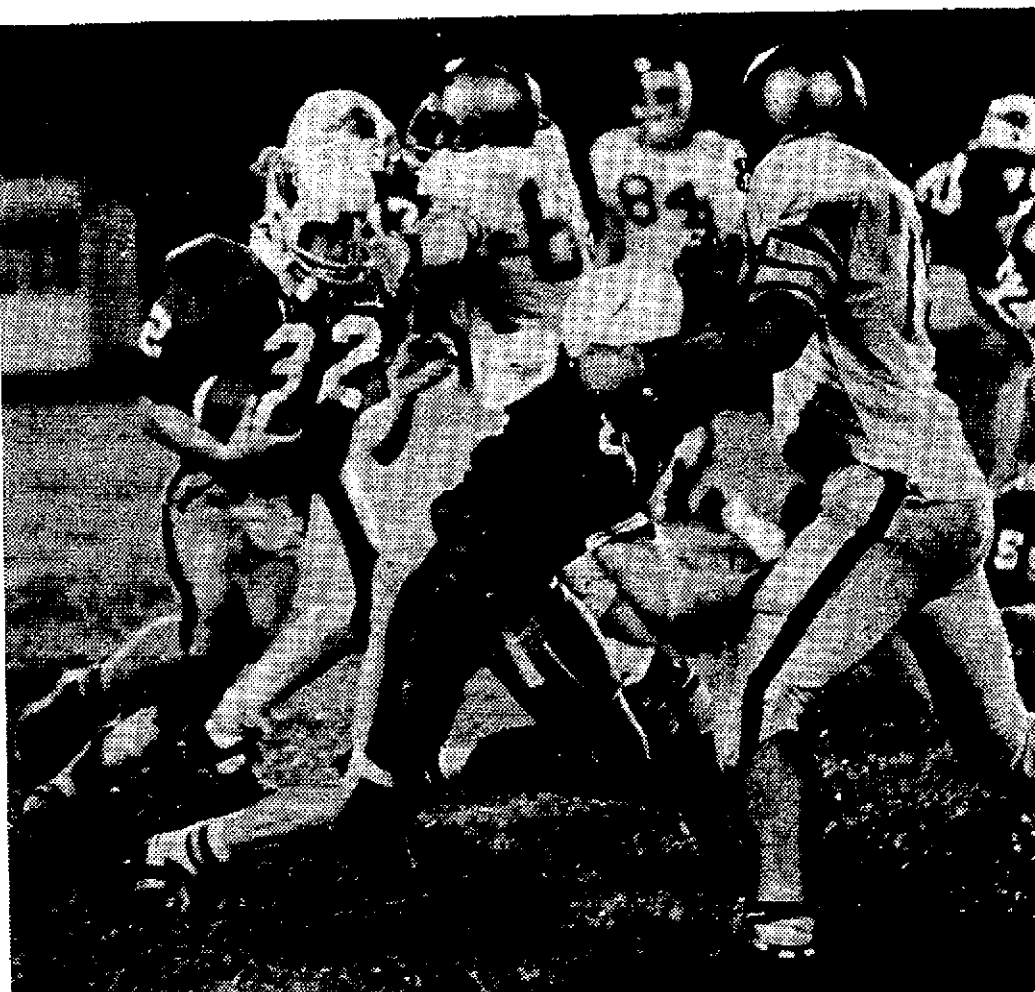

Davis Touts Brown Defense

CLEVELAND (AP) — Cleveland Browns defensive back Ben Davis expressed confidence in the club's defense Friday as the Browns made plans for Monday's invasion by Oakland in an American Football Conference game.

"Nick Skorich is aware of the defense's ability to win ball game," said Davis, who regained his starting job this year after missing the 1970 season with an injury.

"He sees the role of the defense."

"I don't believe that Cleveland has been a defensive team since I've been here. It's getting that way now. The difference has come through hard work and personnel coming into its own."

Skorich, who took over the coaching chores from retired Blanton Collier this season, promised a major improvement in defense and so far the defensive team has not given up a touchdown.

The tour will begin shortly after the World Series and will be 17-days of visiting hospitals and bases in Japan, the Philippines, Okinawa, Guam and Hawaii.
