

Two Schools Tops in JAC

Loudonville and Crestline High Schools shared momentary dual possession of the Johnny Appleseed Conference lead after loop action last night.

The Bulldogs (1-0 in JAC and 2-1 overall) scored a shutout over Clear Fork (0-1 and 0-3), 14-0, and unbeaten Loudonville (1-0 and 3-0) turned back Plymouth (0-1 and 1-2) 14-8.

In JAC games today, Ontario travels to Lexington and Crestview hosts Fredericktown in a pair of 2 p.m. contests.

LOUDONVILLE — Loudonville's offense sputtered throughout the first half of high school football here last night before coming to life for two touchdowns and a conference victory in the final two periods.

The Redbirds, trailing, 8-0, at intermission, drove 52 yards opening the third quarter with Ron Zook bursting off left tackle for the final 17 yards. Zook added two extra points on a run to even the count, 8-8.

Plymouth had scored the second time it laid hands on the football. Starting

Loudonville's go-ahead tally came with 6:54 left in the game. After stopping a Plymouth drive on the Big Red 48-yard line with inches to go for a first down, Loudonville tallied in two plays. Halfback Bob Donelson raced 46 yards off tackle for the score. Donelson gained 72 yards in 12 carries for the Redbirds. Teammate Bob Taylor netted 75 yards in 16 attempts.

Plymouth's Kim Carter carried nine times for 46 yards.

Clear Fork fumble on the Colt 33-yard line. Bauer scored on one yard out five plays later to give Crestline a 6-0 margin mid-

way through the third period.

A roughing-the-kicker infraction set up the second scoring drive guided by Bauer. The senior signal-caller raced 20 yards to paydirt climaxing an 11-play, 67-yard drive with 2:24 remaining, to insure the Bulldog victory.

A stalwart Crestline defense turned back several Clear Fork threats late in the game, as Defensive end, Jeff Cheney nailed Colt quarterback, Russ Barr for an 11-yard loss which stymied one drive, and Roy Dent picked off a Barr aerial to stop another.

Bauer took rushing honors with 96 yards on 13 carries and passed for 77 more. Bulldog halfback, Spencer Adams totaled 69 yards in 16 attempts with Clear Fork's Randy Thomas packing the Colts with 37 ground yards.

Ex-Fireman Gets Hot

Rookie Shares Lead in Golf Meet

ROBINSON, III. (AP) — Rookie Dwight Nevil was playing it cool with his share of the lead in the second round of the \$100,000 Robinson Open golf tournament.

"I'd like to hang on to it" the 27-year-old rookie from San Antonio, Texas, said Friday after shooting a 68 for 135, seven under par. "But I'm not going to say I'm gonna win it until it's all over on Sunday. If I'm still leading then, well, then I'll talk about it."

"This has been my week — at least for two days. But I could shoot 80 Saturday."

Nevil, a one-time Dallas fireman, was tied with chipper Jim Colbert, who needed only 27 strokes with his "Moon Pie" putter to shoot a five-under-par 66 and move into a tie for the top spot.

Troubled Lee Trevino, who has his problems since his whirlwind sweep of the American, Canadian and British Opens, had a 74 for 146 and missed the cut for the final two rounds.

It was the fifth consecutive tournament in which Trevino, the No. 2 money winner at \$197,219, had failed to qualify for the final 36 holes.
