# Sailors Pass Final Test For No. 10

## First Genuine Perfect Season In 11-Man Football History

Vermilion's Sailors last night put the cap on the first perfect 11-man football season in the school's history, as the team had smooth sailing in a 42-20 conquest of host Firelands (5-5). The other perfect season in the school's history came in 1945, when the Sailors were still playing six-man football.

"It feels great. I've been coaching for five years, and you kind of wonder if you'll ever have an undefeated team. You always kind of hope for one, but this year's team exceeded my fondest expectations. We just weren't to be denied.

THE SAILORS moved out to a 24-0 halftime lead, scoring 12 points in each of the first two quarters. Senior fullback Ernie Caldwell tallied on a two-yard run.

"After the game there was a lot of yelling, and the kids went wild. The kids really deserve this season. They haven't had a chance to unwind all year. They're a great bunch of kids.



# Bellamy, Brutsche Guide St. Paul To Hard-Fought 21-20 Win Over Plymouth

A pair of juniors teamed up to lead Norwalk St. Paul to a hair-raising 21-20

victory at Plymouth last night. Fullback Tom Bellamy established a single season rushing record at 1,336 yards in bolting for 115 yards in 31 carries ... and the 155-pound speedster also registered a pair of touchdowns. He carried the ball 238 times this season.

HOWEVER, IT was the foot of John Brutsche that made the difference. The 175-pound kicker booted three consecutive extra points to secure an 8-2 record for first-year coach Bill Hubans.
