Jeff Ringold Builds 702 Series

Jeff Ringold forgot to take his bowling ball to Park Lanes with him yesterday. Little did he know that the lapse would turn into a blessing in disguise. So instead of his own ball, he used two from Park and with them he built his highest career series, a 702 in the Junior League.

"I usually keep my ball at the Lanes," the 18-year-old graduate of Mansfield Senior said. "However, this time I had it at home and forgot it."
His previous high series was a 676, bowled last week. Games yesterday of 246, 198 and 258 boosted his average to 214, his second highest ever.
"I had a 227 average for one week last year," he gleamed.
The 702 is the second 700 series in Mansfield Junior Bowling history.
In his first game, a 246, Ringold threw seven straight strikes. Things didn't go quite as well in the second when he failed to break 200 with a 198. But the third capped the day. Six straight strikes followed by only two misses boosted him above the 700 mark.
Following Ringold was Bob Sanders, who threw a 214-263-216-683 in the same loop.
"I didn't realize what I had until Bob told me that if I struck out in the last frame he would beat me. And that's just what I did."
